I've Heard that Ohio Residents Can Now Purchase and Set Off Fireworks. What are the Guidelines?

Ohioans can discharge consumer fireworks on the following dates and times: July 3, 4, and 5, and the weekends immediately before and after, 4 – 11 PM Labor Day weekend, 4 – 11 PM Diwali, 4 – 11 PM New Year's Eve, 4 – 11:59 PM New Year's Day, 12 – 1 AM and 4 p- 11 PM Chinese New Year, 4 – 11 PM Cinco de Mayo, 4 – 11 PM

Other guidelines to be aware of:

Juneteenth, 4 – 11 PM

Memorial Day weekend, 4 – 11 PM

- Consumers can discharge fireworks on their own property or on another person's property if the owner of that property has given express permission.
- Fireworks cannot be discharged on public property or private school property. This includes city sidewalks, curbs, and streets unless a permit is obtained.
- No person under the age of 18 is permitted to handle or discharge fireworks and cannot be within 150 feet of the discharge point of aerial fireworks.
- No person can use fireworks while in possession or control of, or under the influence of, any intoxicating liquor, beer, or controlled substance. A person who violates this is guilty of a first-degree misdemeanor.
- Aerial devices cannot be discharged within 150 feet of spectators (this includes aerial shells, roman candles, cakes, and bottle rockets).
- Non-aerial devices cannot be discharged within 50 feet of spectators (this includes fountains, firecrackers, and ground effect devices). Note: These separation distances, for both aerial and non-aerial devices, are increased for certain types of locations such as schools, healthcare and residential facilities, apartment and multi-tenant buildings, railroads.
- No person can store in excess of 125 pounds of fireworks unless they have additional safety measures and safeguards in place for such storage.
- Fireworks cannot be aimed at or discharged toward any person or object (such as buildings).

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK IS OCT 8-14

2023 Theme: Cooking safety starts with you! Pay attention to fire prevention!

- Do not leave the kitchen while food is cooking. People sometimes forget they have food on the stove, such as boiling eggs, making hummingbird water, or a casserole in the oven.
- Be wary of cooking in the middle of the night. There have been instances of people falling asleep on the couch while waiting for a pizza or casserole to cook in the oven.
- Do not lay items on top of a stove to use it as additional counter space. A towel laying on the stove can catch fire.



- If a power outage occurs during meal prep, turn knobs off.

 People may forget they had the stove on when power is off for several hours, and when power comes back on the stove or oven continues to heat and the food items catch fire.
- Also pets or small children can accidently turn knobs on depending on where the location of the knobs are. Keep pets and young children away always. Be aware of bumping into knobs; it's not always just the kids and pets. Bumping into a knob can happen just during meal prep or when there are a lot of people in the kitchen.
- Verify that all fire extinguishers are fully charged and in working order
- Teach your kids how to respond in the event of a fire and how to dial 911.





Safely Dispose of Prescription Medications!



The Sharonville Police Department is participating in National Drug Take Back Day. The public can safely dispose of prescription medications allowing them to remove unneeded medications from their homes as a measure of preventing medication misuse and opioid addiction from ever starting.

If you can't attend, there is a drop box located in the Sharonville Police Department lobby that is available 24/7. Pills should be emptied from their original bottles and placed in sealed baggies prior to disposing in the drop box. Sealable baggies are stocked at the drop box for public use. Liquids and needles are not accepted.

When to stop for a school bus in Ohio

On a road with fewer than four lanes, all traffic approaching a stopped school bus from either direction must stop at least 10 feet from the front or rear of the bus and remain stopped until the bus begins to move or the bus driver signals motorists to proceed.







TWO-LANE HIGHWAT WITH CENTER TORN LAN

If the bus is stopped on a street with four or more lanes, only traffic proceeding in the same direction as the bus must stop.

Failure to stop for a school bus adds 2 points to your license in Ohio and is punishable by fines up to \$500. You must appear in court and the judge has the discretion to suspend your driver's license for up to one year. A driver who injures a pedestrian while failing to comply with school bus safety laws can face both criminal charges and civil liability. Those liabilities can include the victim's medical expenses, lost wages, rehabilitation, and non-economic damages, such as pain and suffering.

Our department takes reports of violators by First Student bus service seriously.

Reminder – All residents of Sharonville 18 years and older are required to file a Sharonville tax return each year.

What are the Estimate Tax Due Dates?

Invoices will be sent this year for the final quarterly payment which is due on or before January 16, 2024. Failure to pay at least 90% of your 2023 tax liability by this time may result in a 15% penalty.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld, they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties. If you owe less than \$200 but still wish to make estimate payments please note this on your tax return.

DID YOU FORGET TO FILE YOUR SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

Please file as soon as possible. Mail your return or stop by our office for assistance. Continuing to delay filing will only increase possible penalties.

FILED A FEDERAL EXTENSION?

All 2022 local tax returns with a Federal extension are due by October 16, 2023. A copy of the extension should accompany the filed tax return to avoid a late filing fee. Extensions only extend the time allowed to file a tax return, they do not extend the payment due dates.

EXPECTING A REFUND?

Refunds are processed in the order received. You should expect a check to arrive within 90 days.

RECEIVED A LETTER ASKING FOR MORE DOCUMENTS?

If we didn't receive all the required documents (W-2s or federal forms), a request is sent to verify the data on your tax return. Please send the requested information in as soon as possible so your tax return can be completed. Failure to send in these documents can result in lost credits, late filing fees, or additional charges if a payment is subsequently due.

Working from Home during 2023?

If you are working from your Sharonville residence 100% of the time or on a hybrid schedule, your employer is generally required to withhold 1.5% of your wages and remit those taxes to the Sharonville Tax Office. There are some exceptions; we can discuss your personal situation with you.

How Do I Pay My Tax?

- Bi-monthly invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due, please call.
- Check or money order payments may be mailed in or placed in the secure drop box by our front door and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. *ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.
- If your balance has been sent to the Ohio Attorney General all payments must be paid directly to them at P.O. Box 89471, Cleveland OH, 44101. If you have questions, contact them at 1-888-871-8838 or visit their web site at www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.

MILL CREEK TRIANGLE TRAIL

The City of Sharonville is working with the multi partners including Tri-State Trails, Mill Creek Alliance, Great Parks of Hamilton County, the Sharon Creek Collaborative (SCC) and the Mill Creek Collaborative (MCC) on expanding recreational trail opportunities within the area. Participating local governments include Evendale, Reading, Glendale, and Sharonville, along with Great Parks of Hamilton County.

Great Parks recently acquired ownership of a former Norfolk Southern rail line along Sharon Creek in Sharonville and Evendale. This year, the partnership will be contracting with a design engineer to explore trail alignment options and recommend a preferred route, develop cost estimates for the preferred route and alternatives, hold public engagement for the project, and position segments of the preferred trail routes to apply for Federal and State grant funding for future construction. The partnership is being led by Tri-State Trails who has already successfully implemented other multi-use trail projects in the region.

Phases 1A and 1B of the project involves a multi-use trail from the downtown Sharonville Loop south to Glendale-Milford Road in Evendale along Sharon Creek. Long term conceptual plans call for a multi-use trail connection from Evendale through the downtown Sharonville Loop into Sharon Woods Park.

Attention Owners of Single-Family Properties

The City of Sharonville has regulations against the Short-Term Rentals of single-family properties. This regulation was reviewed and approved in 2019. The City desires to protect the health, safety, welfare, and quality of life of neighborhoods while preserving existing single family residential structures in Sharonville. As a result, a ban on Short-Term Rentals was implemented in order to maintain quiet, clean, orderly, safe, and stable single-family residential neighborhoods in the City.

Short-Term Rentals are defined as a residential structure or part thereof, located in any Single Family area of the City of Sharonville, which is leased or rented for a period of 30 or fewer calendar days in length. If a person violates this chapter/ordinance, they are guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined up to one hundred dollars (\$100.00); any such violation shall constitute a separate offense on each successive day continued. The legislation on Short-Term Rentals is outlined in part seven of the Business Regulation Code Chapter 714. The Business Regulation Code Chapter 714 is not a zoning ordinance therefore Short-Term Rentals are not "grandfathered".





SEASONAL REMINDERS

FALL:

- There is no leaf pick up program in the City of Sharonville raking leaves into the street gutters is not permitted.
- Raking leaves into the gutter causes catch basins to back up and flood streets. Rake and bag leaves for pick up and disposal with Rumpke on your trash days. Rumpke has a 10 item limit.
- If you have a storm culvert that runs along your property line or under your driveway, it is the homeowner's responsibility to keep these culverts and the inlets clear of leaves and debris. Clogged culverts affect drainage upstream and flooding on roadways and surrounding areas.

WINTER:

- During a snowstorm, do NOT park vehicles on the street. Cars parked on the street create additional obstacles and restrict visibility. Parking your vehicle in your driveway allows for a more complete clearing of your street. Wherever practical, we will attempt to keep the snow build-up to a minimum. We are unable to remove plowed snow from in front of driveways. This is the responsibility of the property owner and/or tenant. Do not shovel snow into the street.
- Older residents and those with health problems are reminded to avoid physical activity associated with shoveling snow.
- Stay at least two car lengths behind a snow plow for every 10 mph you are traveling. Never cut in between a caravan of plows clearing a road.
- Beware of black ice, roads that look wet but actually are glazed with ice. Ramps and bridges freeze first.
- Winter weather brings potholes and other unsafe conditions.
 Please notify Public Works of any curb, street, sidewalk or storm drainage problems in the City. The Public Works Department will attempt to correct the safety problems in a timely manner.

Brush and Special Pick-up Service

- Curbside brush and special pickup is a FREE year-round service (unless it is snowing and we are treating the roads) to residents.
- Residents must call before 5:00 p.m. Friday to have their address put on a list for pick up the following week. Have the materials out for removal on Sunday evening of the requested service week.
- Brush chipping is limited to 15 minutes per stop. If there is additional debris left after 15 minutes, residents must call to get their name on the list for the next week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular trash collection.

TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available until October 27th for 2023 for large trash disposal.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend. For businesses, it is \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck.

DISPOSAL REMINDERS

- Please keep lids on trash cans at all times. Lids help keep rain water out of the cans making them manageable to handle for trash collection. Please make sure cans have useable handles.
- Refrigerators, freezers and other appliances that contain chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants must have the CFC removed from the appliance by a Certified Technician. Attach documentation from the technician to the appliance verifying that the CFC has been removed. Call RUMPKE at 513-851-0122 a day in advance of your normal trash pickup day to notify them of an appliance pick up. There is paperwork on Rumpke's website (rumpke.com) that needs to be taped to the appliance.
- Couches, chairs, mattresses and box springs MUST be wrapped in plastic and sealed tight with tape at the curb for normal trash pickup. Call RUMPKE at 513-851-0122 a day in advance to notify them of a large item pickup.



- Computers, televisions, fluorescent bulbs and hazardous waste cannot be placed at the curb for Rumpke trash collection. The Hamilton County and Butler County Recycling and Solid Waste Districts can help you with disposal of electronic and hazardous waste items for homeowners ONLY. Fluorescent bulbs can be taken to hardware stores (Home Depot, Lowes, and Menards) for proper disposal. ENERGY AGGREGATION PROGRAM UPDATE

Natural Gas

Program pricing for residential and small business accounts is fixed at 52.4 cents per ccf through meter reads in June 2024. Currently, Duke utility's price is 58.68 cents per ccf, and will fluctuate monthly in response to variations in weather, natural gas production & storage, and global events. To join the program, contact IGS Energy at 1-877-353-0162 and state you want to join the "Sharonville, OH Natural Gas Aggregation program". It can take 30-60 days for your account to be served through the program. The IGS logo and the 52.4 cent per unit price appearing on your Duke invoice in the "Billing details – Gas" block of your Duke bill indicates you are in the program.

Electric

The City's program, served by Energy Harbor at a fixed rate of 4.72 cents per kWh for carbon-free energy, ends at meter reads in December 2023. We are currently seeking competitive bids to supply our next program. Utility electric prices in Ohio increased dramatically in June 2023. Duke's pricing climbed to 9-11 cents per kWh and will remain there at least until May 2024. We expect to negotiate program supply to provide significant savings. Details will be provided in letters to all eligible participants in late October 2023. Eligible participants are those residential and small business customers who:

- Are located within the City of Sharonville boundaries
- Are currently participating in the electric aggregation OR taking supply from the utility if you are under a separate contract with another supplier, you should not receive the letter
- Are not participating in Duke's Percentage of Income Payment Program (PIPP)
- Are not in arrears on payment with Duke utility



Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID Card. This card will be scanned against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.



Supervision & Guest Policy

Our goal in this policy is to accomodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 quests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five granchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.

Refund Policy

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances (a doctor's note may be required), if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.

FITNESS & WELLNESS

Fitness Center

Our Fitness Center includes cardio and strength equipment for folks of all abilities, regardless of experience or level of fitness. Our free weight area includes an excellent selection of weights and other accessories that can take your functional fitness routine to the next level.





Walking/Running Track

The indoor track is a great way to stay in shape all year long. The track was designed with a cushioned surface to reduce impact as well as banked corners for running comfort. Fitness equipment has been added to the track corners to help take your workout even further.



Fitness Center Equipment Orientations

This 45 to 60 minute session is designed to introduce our equipment and basic components of exercise. It will include a personal workout card on which the staff will note seat heights and other information for future use. Orientations are given by appointment only. New members are encouraged to take advantage of this FREE service. Please note that anyone 13 to 17 years of age is required to complete an orientation before using the fitness center. Please stop by the customer service desk to



fill out the appropriate forms and schedule your appointment.

Fitness Center Personal Training

If you are new to exercise or looking for a change in your workout, one of the Recreation Department's personal trainers can assist you free of charge. An initial consultation will be scheduled to determine your fitness level and goals. The trainer will take this information and apply it when creating an individual workout plan for you. Once the plan is developed the trainer will meet with you to discuss exercises and walk you through proper lifting techniques. Our trainers will check on you regularly to ensure you stay motivated or to see if you need additional assistance. Core Strength: Targets the abs, back, and glutes to improve core strength, stability, and posture using body weight, resistance bands, and free weights.

Cycle: Climb and sprint your way to improved cardiovascular fitness as you pedal to the beat in this music driven, high energy, high intensity cycling interval class

HIIT: Incorporates several rounds that alternate between high intensity movements to significantly increase heart rate to 80% of max. heartrate followed by short periods of lower intensity movements.

Line Dancing: Choreographed dances with a repeated sequence of steps in which a group of people dance in one or more lines or rows. Participants all face each other or in the same direction, and executing the steps at the same time.

Strength & Endurance: Burn calories while building strength and endurance through a variety of body weight and free weight exercises targeting all major muscle groups.

YIN Yoga: This relaxing class is a great compliment to your fitness routine as it will boost circulation, increase flexibility, lengthen connective tissue, and reduce stress. Poses are held for 3-5 minutes per side using a variety of props to support the weight of the body. No flow or standing postures, all poses done on the floor. Appropriate for all levels.

Yoga: Energize your body and soul with dynamic yoga. Stretch and strengthen while improving posture, balance, and coordination. This vitalizing practice is designed to stimulate and balance all systems of the body.




