Message from the Mayor



Filing Due Dates

Individual Returns: On or before April 18, 2022

Net Profit Business Returns: On or before **April 18, 2022** or the 15th day of the 4th month following the end of the fiscal year.

Withholding Reconciliations: On or before February 28, 2022



DO I NEED TO FILE A TAX RETURN?

Yes, if any of the following apply:

- You are a resident of Sharonville 18 years old or older, regardless of your income level.
- You are under 18 years old and have earned income.
- You are a non-resident who works within the City of Sharonville and your income is not fully withheld by an employer.
- You are engaged in a business within the City of Sharonville and have sales, perform services or own rental property, whether or not tax is due.
- Your business is located within or doing business within the City of Sharonville.

What Do I Need to Bring with Me or Send in with My Sharonville Tax Return?

- 1. W-2 form(s)
- 2. Federal 1040 tax return including:
- Schedule 1, C, E, F and/or 4797 if applicable
- Documentation for any income reported on your Federal tax form as "other income" (line 8 on the Federal 1040)
- Any other federal schedules or forms which document deductions or additions to your local tax return
- 3. Copies of other local tax returns or refund requests you've filed

WHY DO I HAVE TO INCLUDE MY FEDERAL 1040 FORM?

All cities in the State of Ohio require a copy of your federal 1040 form to be included with your local tax return. This helps us assure we have all the necessary paperwork and are taxing & giving credits for the correct amounts.

How Do I Pay My Tax?

- Check or money order payments may be mailed in and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office. A fee is charged by the processing company for debit or credit card payments.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments, Inc either online at www.sharonville.org or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.

Note: Due to low usage by our residents, e-filing is no longer available; however fill in forms are available on our web site at www.sharonville. org/DocumentCenter/Index/61 under Individual Tax Forms.

HOW CAN I GET AN EXTENSION?

If you have received a federal extension to file, you automatically can have an extension with the City of Sharonville until October 15, 2022. A copy of the extension must accompany the filed tax return to avoid penalties. If you do not apply for a federal extension you may request an extension in writing with our office by April 18, 2022. Please remember that an extension to file does not give you an extension to pay your taxes, so be sure to make all payments by April 18th.

WHAT INCOME IS TAXABLE?

- Qualifying wages are defined by the IRS tax code section 3121(a). It includes many different types of income, including but not limited to wages, sick pay, vacation pay, commissions, severance pay, settlements, bonuses, fringe benefits, short-term disability pay, stock options and deferred compensation. It is usually found in Box 5 (Medicare wages) on your W-2, however there are some exceptions.
- Other income (generally listed on line 8 of your Federal 1040 Schedule 1) such as gambling winnings, HSA and scholarship distributions, director's fees, jury duty income and prize winnings.
- The net of all profit and losses from profession and/or business operations.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties.

If you owe less than \$200, but still wish to make estimated payments please note this on your tax return.

Second quarter estimate payments are due by June 15, 2022. For your convenience a coupon was sent with your 2021 tax return. Invoices will be sent for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2022 and January 17, 2023.

- Please make an appointment for Sharonville tax return preparation in our office at: cityofsharonvilletaxoffice. setmore.com. Walk-ins may be accepted if there are available appointment times.
- We recommend you file early, as the number of people seeking assistance increases dramatically as the tax filing deadline approaches.
- If you have multiple years to file, please call us to make an appointment.
- For appointments, please bring all the required items listed on the previous page.
- Paperwork or check or money order payments may be deposited into the secure drop box to the left of the front door.

WHAT IF I WORKED FROM HOME DURING 2021?

If you worked from home during the tax year 2021, you can request a refund of local tax withheld by your employer for the work place city for those days. If a refund is requested your tax credit on line 8 of our IR form will be reduced. Please attach a copy of the refund request with your Sharonville return.

WHAT INCOME IS EXEMPT FROM TAX?

- Interest, dividends, some royalties
- Capital gains (unless considered ordinary income)
- Alimony
- Military pay and allowances
- Proceeds from qualified IRS defined retirement plans
- Social Security benefits, welfare benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, workers' compensation

This information regarding income is not all encompassing. Please contact our office if you have questions regarding the taxability of specific types of income.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years. For further information on the collection and payment of property taxes, please contact either the Hamilton County Auditor's office at (513) 946-4000 or the Butler County Auditor's office at (513) 887-3154. Links to these offices are available on the Sharonville website.

SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX

The City of Sharonville is within the Princeton City School District. The code for state income tax form purposes is 3116.

MOST COMMONLY MADE ERRORS

 Not attaching the required forms – W-2(s), Federal 1040 & Schedule 1:

In addition to your Federal 1040 we need your W-2(s) and if you file a Schedule 1, we will need a copy of it as well as any included additional schedules (C, E, F and/or 4797). This will clarify the income reported on the Schedule 1 and eliminate unnecessary correspondence.

Net Operating Losses:

Businesses, including individuals filing Schedules C, E, and/or F, now have limitations to the amount of carried-forward losses they can use. For 2021, business losses from 2017 through 2020 may only be used up to a maximum of the lesser of 50% of the loss carried forward, or 50% of 2021's profit. The remaining loss may be carried forward for up to five (5) years.

Too Much Credit for Other Municipalities:

Credit for taxes withheld or paid to another municipality is available to residents. It is limited to 1.5% of the amount of W-2 wages taxed to another municipality, and no amounts exceeding the 1.5% limit will be credited toward additional taxable income. Credits for taxes paid for business income are also limited to 1.5% and are pro-rated based on percentage of total business income. Documentation is required for any credit. We added Worksheet A on the back of your Sharonville income tax return to help you calculate this credit. There are no credits given for county, mental health, or school taxes paid.

SPRING DRIVING TIPS

Watch out for each other. Spring weather brings people out of their homes and into our parks, sidewalks, and roads. Bicycles and motorcycles that have been put away all winter are back on the road. Kids that have been longing to stretch their legs and toss the football or baseball may run into the street. Be defensive in your driving and resist the urge to be distracted by the beautiful weather. Look twiceyou just might save a life!



Slow down in the rain. Be sure to drive appropriately for the conditions. Rain soaked roads are slippery and require you to leave additional space between your car and the one in front of you. If you start to hydroplane-don't panic! Take your foot off the gas and gently apply the brakes. Avoid the natural tendency to steer aggressively and slam on the brakes. Hydroplaning typically won't last long, so don't make it worse by oversteering and braking hard.

Stay off of flooded roads. Some low-lying areas are prone to flooding during heavy rains. Every year several roads have to be temporarily

shut down and drivers become stuck while trying to forge the flooded roadways. Always heed high water or road closed signs. A detour is certainly less inconvenient and less expensive than a swamped car. High water is extremely dangerous. Even



moderately high water can easily sweep away a motor vehicle or someone trying to walk through it.

Make sure your vehicle is ready. Winter is extremely rough on motor vehicles. Spring is a great time to service your car and check it for several things that will help keep you driving safe in the spring. Check your wipers and make sure they are working properly or just simply replace them. Check your tires. Poor tread, dry-rotted tires, or under/overinflated tires are very dangerous. Traction and visibility are your two biggest allies when dealing with inclement weather.

HIGH GRASS AND WEEDS

With the spring season arriving, the City of Sharonville is asking residents and businesses to be cognizant of basic exterior property maintenance and housekeeping. One of the most frequent complaints the City receives during the spring and summer months is about high grass and weeds on private properties. The City of Sharonville Codified Ordinances Section 521.13 states grass over eight (8") inches in height is considered a nuisance and must be cut.

Once a complaint for high grass and weeds on private properties is received, the Community Development Department follows these protocols:


Residential Properties: An inspection is made to verify the alleged violation. If a violation exists, a notice of the violation will be posted to the offending property. If the tall grass is not mowed within 10 days of the post date, the City will send a City crew to cut the grass. All costs incurred by the City to cut the tall grass, including time and equipment used, can quickly add up. The minimum charge for the City to mow an offending property is \$250.00; the larger the area to be mowed and the higher the grass, the higher the costs. The costs associated with mowing private property are then billed directly to the property owner. If the property owner fails to return payment to the City within 30 days, the City will add the total costs to the Official Tax Duplicate in the form of a lien on the offending property.

PROTECTING STORM WATER

The Hamilton County Storm Water District offers a variety of resources that can benefit residential as well as commercial properties. Here are a couple tips:

- 1. Do not put anything into a storm drain.
- 2. Sweep grass clippings into the yard, not the street.
- 3. Test your soil fertility so that you don't apply unneeded chemicals!
- 4. Have your vehicles maintained regularly to prevent fluid leaks and recycle all vehicle fluids properly.
- 5. Pick up pet waste and put it in the trash!

Commercial/Industrial Properties: While some exemptions may apply, grass and weeds on commercial and industrial properties are also required to be maintained and may not be taller than eight (8") inches in height; this includes any vacant, developed, or undeveloped commercial/industrial property. If a complaint is received, the process is the same to achieve compliance.

Reporting Potential High Grass and Weed Violations

Please have the address of the offending property or other descriptive information if the violation will not be visually obvious from the public street. For example, indicate if high grass or weeds are in the rear or back yard or hidden by a privacy fence.

PERMITS & ZONING GUIDELINES FOR SHEDS

Before building or placing your structure, create a site plan and file for a permit at the Community Development Department. This will determine if the location is compliant with zoning setbacks, as well as soundly built to meet code requirements. Failure to comply could lead to unnecessary violations for the owner and abutting neighbors that are preventable.

General guidelines:

- An accessory structure shall not be constructed in the front or side yard.
- The detached accessory structure should not be closer than 20 feet to any main building or any right of way street, nor shall it be closer than 5 feet to any side or rear lot line.
- Shall not exceed 14 ft. in height.
- Shall not exceed an area of 500 sq. ft.


Be aware of drainage swales/easements may not be apparent, but placing building structures, even landscaping, in these easement areas can create major drainage issues for residential properties.

Spring & Summer Services

TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available mid-April through October for large trash disposal.
- The truck will be brought to your home or business by 3:00 p.m. and picked up the next morning by 7:30 a.m.
- A release of liability must be signed by the property owner at least 24 hours before the scheduled rental day.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend; for businesses it is \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck starting April 1.

BRUSH AND SPECIAL PICK-UP SERVICE

- Curbside Brush and Special Pickup is a FREE year round service to residents.
- Residents must call by Friday before 5 p.m. to be on a list for pick up the following week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular garbage pick-up.



INSTALLING A NEW DRIVEWAY

- You must obtain a permit to install a new driveway from the Community Development Department cost is \$40.
- There is no fee or permit required to install a driveway apron. It must be inspected at least 24 hours prior to pouring the cement.
- Call Public Works before constructing a driveway or apron for specifications and inspection requirements.

YARD WASTE

Grass, weeds, twigs, and leaves can be disposed of using one of the following methods:

- Composting on your property.
- Placing yard waste and garden waste in bags or cans at the curb with regular trash collection.
- Separate yard & garden waste from your regular trash and take the yard waste to one of the three recycling drop-off locations for residents of Hamilton County (free service). For more information call YARDWASTE HOTLINE at (513) 946-7755.
- Please do not blow grass clippings or leaves into the street as these waste materials could clog storm drains.

GOLDEN VIEW ACRES

Golden View Acres is a 52-unit Senior Citizen Retirement Village located on Greensfelder Lane off Thornview Drive. To be eligible for tenancy, a person must be at least 57 years of age and a current Sharonville resident for at least one year; or be a parent, grandparent, brother or sister of a current Sharonville resident who has resided in the City for one year.



Golden View Acres has both first and second floor units and one and two bedroom apartments. Each apartment has an equipped kitchen with stove and refrigerator, gas heat, hot water, and air conditioning. Tenants pay their own utilities except water. There are coin operated laundry facilities in each of the three buildings. The complex is a "Smoke Free" facility. After signing a lease agreement, THE RENT IS NOT RAISED unless an additional tenant occupies the same apartment or the current tenant moves to another apartment in the complex. At that time, a new rental agreement is then drawn up at the current rate.

To be placed on a WAITING LIST to rent an apartment, a written application must be made and a \$50 fee deposited. This fee is refundable when you rent an apartment or request, in writing, to be taken off the Waiting List.

- West side of Willfleet Dr will be in Ward 4





Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID card. This card will be scanned by the "Safe Point" System against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

The entire membership card data base is scanned through the "Safe Point" system twice a year. New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.

Stay & Play Zone

The Stay & Play Zone is available for children ages 1-9 while their parent/guardian works out or participates in a program. Nursery service is FREE for children who have a current Combo Membership. The fee for those without a membership is \$3.00 per child per hour. Maximum 2 hours per day. We can accomodate 6 children per hour.
