### Message from the Mayor

In the Summer of 1999, I was running my first race for elective office here in Sharonville. To become more aware of the issues facing our community, I attended a few council meetings at that time. Council decided to take this particular meeting "on the road" to Depot Square. The City had just completed a renovation of the area and wished to highlight the new amenities – decking and planters around the Depot Square building and caboose,



brick pavers, and a train gazebo with working fountain. Much has changed in the two decades since then and it has come time for a re-invention of this City focal point.

With the assistance of Kleingers Group, we are in the thick of the design phase for a re-imagined Depot Square. The Sharonville Cultural Arts Center kindly opened their doors in August for an open house discussion on concept plans for the area. Some of that work is featured on the cover and in this edition of the Hometown Guide. The goal is to continue to leverage our city property in a way that attracts visitors to "The Loop" and thus support the ongoing business interests in this historic portion of our city. We had an excellent response from those in attendance regarding concepts that were liked, not liked, or may need some additional exploration. We encourage you to continue sharing your thoughts regarding these plans with our City staff, myself or other elected officials.

This is only Phase One in our focus on "The Loop." As we settle on plans for Depot Square, secure funding to turn those plans into reality, and then begin construction, we will move beyond that corner and into the sidewalks, streetscapes and public parking areas of 'The Loop." It is an exciting time for our historic downtown as we strive to maintain the historic elements of this district while meeting the 21st century needs and desires of our residents, visitors, and businesses. All of this is to keep Sharonville THE place to LIVE, WORK and PLAY.

# I Understand the City of Sharonville Has a Mayor's Court. How Does It Work? Does our Mayor Run It?

No, the City of Sharonville Mayor does not manage the court. The court is presided over by a magistrate who is certified by law to hear and determine cases filed in Mayor's Court. Court takes place in Council Chambers at the city building at 10900 Reading Road each Wednesday at 3:00 PM. Advantages for having a local mayor's court rather than a municipal court include convenient location and the hearings are more informal while the defendant still has access to a public defender and translator if needed. Our Mayor's Court hears Minor Misdemeanor cases as well as First through Fourth degree Misdemeanors.



The Mayor's Court of Sharonville is a member of the Association of Mayor's Court Clerks of Ohio and Southwest Association of Mayor's Court Clerks and registered with the Supreme Court of Ohio.

The Mayor's Court Clerk of Courts Office is located within the Sharonville Police Department at 3639 East Kemper Road. They have a service window accessible from the public lobby. They can help you with the following:

- Answer questions about monies owed to the court
- Direction to the court
- Help direct you to other agencies that can provide further assistance, if needed, i.e. Bureau of Motor Vehicles
- Reschedule court dates
- Information about your case
- Record sealing
- Understanding how the court works

The Mayor's Court Clerk of Courts cannot:

- Fill out forms for you
- Give you legal advice
- Tell you how the magistrate may rule in your particular case
- Tell you how you should plead your case
- Tell you what you should say or write

#### SHARONVILLE ZONING CODE UPDATE


Throughout the course of 2021, Sharonville City Staff, the Sharonville 2030 Zoning Code Update Review Committee, and the City's consultants have been working to update the zoning code. Now on the Sharonville 2030 website, you will find all the chapters that have been drafted and reviewed to date. Among these draft chapters are the following:

- General Provisions
- Establishment of Zoning Districts
- Base Zoning Districts and Principal Uses
- Overlay Zoning Districts
- Planned Unit Developments
- Accessory and Temporary Uses
- General Development Standards
- Historic Preservation
- Architectural Standards
- Decision-Making Roles and Authorities
- Review Procedures
- Nonconformities
- Enforcement and Penalties

Available on the Sharonville 2030 website is a draft of the full code in a single document as well as the ability to download individual chapters. Each chapter includes a one-page summary of changes to be aware of and a series of references and footnotes to guide you through the thought process.

Only four chapters are left to be drafted and reviewed! The four remaining chapters are: Landscaping and Screening, Parking, Access, and Connectivity, Signs, and Subdivision Design. Once available, these chapters will be added to the 2030 website for public review.

# DOWNTOWN LOOP STREETSCAPE PLAN Progress Continues on the Project!

In June of 2020, the City of Sharonville City Council approved the Sharonville Downtown Loop Streetscape Master Plan. The Master Plan was funded by Hamilton County Planning & Development, and the project was led by the Kleingers Group consultants based here in Cincinnati.

The Conceptual Streetscape Master Plan includes a range of many options. Some options are incorporated from the earlier 2010 Plan that have been refreshed including new additions for slowing down traffic through Downtown Sharonville. These options will likely be implemented in phases after final traffic and transportation engineering review and approval by City Council.

In the image on the next page, one of three concepts, is shown for the reimagining of Depot Square. This concept involves redeveloping the Depot Square public space and keeping Creek Road as a two-

way street west of Reading Road. Other concepts not shown have the potential redevelopment of the Depot Square public space with conversion of Creek Road into a one-way entrance from the east; in these concepts, traffic would exit back onto Reading Road along Walnut Street or by way of the US Postal Service parking lot.

Other redevelopment includes Creek Road between Reading Road and Main Street that would allow for potential street closures and festivals as seen in the rendering on the cover and on the top of page 6.

None of these concepts have been finalized. At this stage, public opinions are being gathered on the concepts presented. A public open house was hosted at the Sharonville Cultural Arts Center in early August, providing the opportunity for community members to share their ideas and feedback. The open house was well-attended with nearly 40 residents, loop businesses, city elected

officials, and employees showing up to the event!

Once all public comments have been received, they will be forwarded to the Kleingers Group consultants to see if they can be accommodated into the future redevelopment of Depot Square and Creek Road. The ultimate design for these areas will be approved by the Sharonville City Council later in 2021.





#### What are the Estimate Tax Due Dates?

Invoices will be sent this year for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2021 and January 18, 2022. Failure to pay at least 90% of your 2021 tax liability by January 18, 2022 may result in a 15% penalty.

#### DID YOU FORGET TO FILE YOUR SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

Please file as soon as possible. Mail your return or stop by our office for assistance. Continuing to delay filing will only increase possible penalties.

#### FILED A FEDERAL EXTENSION?

All 2020 local tax returns with a Federal extension are due by October 15, 2021. A copy of the extension should accompany the filed tax return to avoid a late filing fee. Extensions only extend the time allowed to file a tax return, they do not extend the payment due dates.

#### How Do I Pay My Tax?

- Bi-monthly invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due please call.
- Check or money order payments may be mailed in or placed in the secure drop box by our front door and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. \*ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.

#### RECEIVED A LETTER ASKING FOR MORE DOCUMENTS?

If we didn't receive all the required documents (W-2s or federal forms), a request is sent to verify the data on your tax return. Please send the requested information in as soon as possible so your tax return can be completed. Failure to send in these documents can result in lost credits, late filing fees, or additional charges if a payment is subsequently due.

#### **EXPECTING A REFUND?**

Refunds are processed in the order received. You should expect a check to arrive within 90 days.

#### PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.



#### SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX

The City of Sharonville is located within the Princeton City School District. The code for state income tax form purposes is 3116.

#### Working from Home in 2020

For the past year many people have worked at home due to the pandemic. In March, 2020 Ohio House Bill 197 was passed which stated that your employer should withhold local income taxes to your normal work location (i.e. principal place of work prior to Covid 19) regardless of your physical location during the 2020 tax year. #### SEASONAL REMINDERS

#### FAII:

- There is no leaf pick up program in the City of Sharonville raking leaves into the street gutters is not permitted.
- Raking leaves into the gutter causes catch basins to back up and flood streets. Rake and bag leaves for pick up and disposal with Rumpke on your trash days. Rumpke has a 10 item limit.
- If you have a storm culvert that runs along your property line or under your driveway, it is the homeowner's responsibility to keep these culverts and the inlets clear of leaves and debris. Clogged culverts affect drainage upstream and flooding on roadways and surrounding areas.

#### WINTER:

- During a snowstorm, do NOT park vehicles on the street. Cars parked on the street create additional obstacles and restrict visibility. Parking your vehicle in your driveway allows for a more complete clearing of your street. Wherever practical, we will attempt to keep the snow build-up to a minimum. We are unable to remove plowed snow from in front of driveways. This is the responsibility of the homeowner. Do not shovel snow into the
- Older residents and those with health problems are reminded to avoid physical activity associated with shoveling snow.
- Stay at least two car lengths behind a snow plow for every 10 mph you are traveling. Never cut in between a caravan of plows clearing a road.
- Beware of black ice, roads that look wet but actually are glazed with ice. Ramps and bridges freeze first.
- Winter weather brings potholes and other unsafe conditions. Please notify Public Works of any curb, street, sidewalk or storm drainage problems in the City. The Public Works Department will attempt to correct the safety problems in a timely manner.

#### Brush and Special Pick-up Service

- Curbside brush and special pickup is a FREE year-round service (unless it is snowing and we are treating the roads) to residents.
- Residents must call before 5:00 p.m. Friday to have their address put on a list for pick up the following week. Have the materials out for removal on Sunday evening of the requested service
- Brush chipping is limited to 15 minutes per stop. Anything left after 15 minutes will be collected the next week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular garbage pick-up.

#### TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available until October 29th for 2021 for large trash disposal.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend. For businesses, it is \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck.

#### **DISPOSAL REMINDERS**

- Please keep lids on trash cans at all times. Lids help keep rain water out of the cans making them manageable to handle for trash collection. Please make sure cans have useable handles.
- Refrigerators, freezers and other appliances that contain chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants must have the CFC removed from the appliance by a Certified Technician. Attach documentation from the technician to the appliance verifying that the CFC has been removed. Call RUMPKE at 513-851-0122 a day in advance of your normal trash pickup day to notify them of an appliance pick up.
- Couches, chairs, mattresses and box springs MUST be wrapped in plastic and sealed tight with tape at the curb for normal trash pickup. Call RUMPKE at 513-851-0122 a day in advance to notify them of a large item pickup.
- Computers, televisions, fluorescent bulbs and hazardous waste cannot be placed at the curb for Rumpke trash collection. The Hamilton County and Butler County Recycling and Solid Waste Districts can help you with disposal of electronic and hazardous waste items for homeowners ONLY. Fluorescent bulbs can be taken to hardware stores (Home Depot, Lowes, and Menards) for proper disposal. #### **S**ENIOR **A**PARTMENTS

Located on Greensfelder Lane off of Thornview Drive, Golden View Acres is a 52-unit apartment senior retirement complex.

In order to be an eligible tenant, a person must be at least 57 years of age and a current Sharonville resident for at least one year, or be a parent, grandparent, or sibling of a current Sharonville resident who is currently residing in the City and has for at least one year.

Golden View Acres has first and second floor units and one and two bedroom apartments. Each apartment has an equipped kitchen with stove and refrigerator, gas heat, hot water, and air conditioning. Tenants pay their own utilities except water. There are coin operated laundry facilities in each of the three buildings. When renting an apartment an initial security deposit equaling one month's rent is required. After signing the lease, THE RENT WILL NOT BE RAISED unless an additional tenant occupies the same apartment or the current tenant moves to another apartment in the complex. At that time, a new rental agreement is required to be signed at the current rate.

To be placed on a WAITING LIST to rent an apartment, a written application must be made and a \$50 fee deposited. This fee is refundable when you rent an apartment or request, in writing, to be removed from the waiting list.





#### **OPEN HOUSE A SUCCESS**

The Sharonville Police Department held an open house August 3rd to showcase their brand new building. Custom cookies and Kona Ice were provided to everyone who attended. Approximately 200 people attended the event; everyone from kids to adults, and some of our Sharonville businesses even stopped by to see our new building.



Officers and civilian employees were stationed all throughout the building to answer questions and provide guidance throughout the self-guided tour. The Sharonville Police Department appreciates so many of the community members were so interested in the new building. This building belongs to everyone in the city and not just the officers, so they were eager to be able to finally show it off! The department is thankful to have the opportunity to conduct business in a new space that allows them to be more efficient and to grow.



#### WALK FOR HOPE TO SUPPORT CHAMPIONS DO OVERCOME

Cody O'Connor was diagnosed with cancer as a child and told he would never walk normally again. He beat those odds and to raise money for Champions Do Overcome, he is walking across America from New York to California. He made a special stop to Sharonville because he has ties to our City! – His grandma, Mary Jo Lemmer, worked in the parish office of St. Michael's for over 20 years. He spent much time in the office and doing maintenance work there over the summers.

#### FIRE HYDRANT ROUTINE CHECKS AND SERVICING

Every year the fire department goes out and services all of the hydrants in the city. In the spring we ensure all of the hydrants are operational, work smoothly, and are not leaking water. Repairs and rechecks are performed as needed.

An additional service performed is repainting hydrants due to rust. You may notice an occasional brown hydrant on the side of the road. The hydrant gets blasted with walnut shells which are bio-degradable and then painted with the brown primer. The next day they are painted safety yellow.

#### YARD WASTE AND OPEN BURNS

As fall season approaches, leaves will be hitting the ground. Leaves and other yard waste are not allowed to be burned in the city of Sharonville. This is considered an open burn and you will be asked to put the fire out.

#### **CHECK SMOKE DETECTORS**

Fire Prevention Week is October 3rd - 9th. This is a great time to check your smoke detector annually. Smoke detectors have a life span of 10 years; if they are older, they need to be replaced. The Sharonville Fire Department provides free smoke detectors and replacement batteries to the citizens of Sharonville. Call the main fire headquarters at 513-563-0252 to schedule a time to have batteries or smoke detectors installed. We do not offer replacement Hardwired Smoke Detectors.



#### **RAISING MONEY IN RESIDENT'S HONOR**

At Sharonfest, Sharonville Professional Firefighters Local 4489 ran a booth to raise money for Spina Bifida Coalition of Cincinnati. They raised over \$800 and donated the money in the name of Bailey Meyer. Bailey is a resident of Sharonville and a 2016 Princeton graduate. She currently works as a preschool teacher at Our Kids Place. Each year in July, community members also hold a Night of Thunder ride to raise money in her name for Spina Bifida Coalition of Cincinnati.

Spina bifida is a neural tube birth defect that affects the spine. Spina bifida can happen anywhere along the spine if the neural tube does not close all the way.

#### **Community Center Access Policy**

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or State ID Card. This card will be scanned by the "Safe Point" System against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

The entire membership card data base is scanned through the "Safe Point" system twice a year. New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or State ID Card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or State ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.

# Stay & Play Zone

The Stay & Play Zone is available for children ages 1-9 while their parent/guardian works out or participates in a program. Nursery service is FREE for children who have a current Combo Membership. The fee for those without a membership is \$3.00 per child per hour. Maximum 2 hours per day. We can accomodate 6 children per hour. ### Supervision & Guest Policy \*Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult member, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five granchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid Driver's License or State ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.

#### **Refund Policy**

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances, if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. (A doctor's note may be required.) Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.




