Message from the Mayor

As with many of you, my spring weekends will be spent watching young people from around our community coming together on soccer and baseball fields. While the element of competition is always there, the most important goals for those involved is that these children are learning how to improve their skills on the field, working together as a team, and modeling good sportsmanship to their opponents. Sometimes, like last spring when the U10 girls' St. Michael's Mustangs and SYO Stingers met up on the field, those friendly competitions turn into reunions of children (and their parents) who



have gone to preschool together or swim as teammates with the Sharonville Sharks. It's during events like these that we can truly feel and appreciate the interconnectedness of our entire city community.

While the City has a role in facilitating these types of activities, mostly through providing the facilities for these activities to take place, it is another vital non-profit organization that truly does all the work. The Sharonville Youth Organization (SYO) has been in existence for more than half-a-century. SYO is a group of dedicated volunteers who arrange the sign up for children in youth sports, provide the equipment to play, recruit and prepare coaches, seek out sponsors for team uniforms, and a multitude of other duties. It was indeed a pleasure a short while ago to recognize these volunteers with a "good neighbor award" for their selflessness and dedication to the youth of Sharonville.

The only way to really make memorable sporting moments is through good people willing to give their time to share these important values with the children of our City. As is often the case with volunteer groups, it can be difficult to find capable persons to take on these tasks. I encourage everyone to think and consider how he or she could be a part of making a difference in the life of a child by volunteering with SYO – whether you currently have a child involved in youth sports, previously had a child in youth sports, you were once a child in SYO sports, or even just want to help teach children critical life skills. Ultimately, that is what a youth sport volunteer does – teach children how to be better members of a community, desirable members of the future workforce, and leaders on and off a sporting field. Won't you be a part of making that difference in a child's life right here in Sharonville?

GIVEN THE NATIONWIDE OPIOID CRISIS, HOW OFTEN IS NARCAN USED BY OUR POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS?

The opioid crisis receives quite a bit of attention, but fortunately the Police and Fire employees have not needed to administer it that often and, on many occasions, it is being used on the traveling public and not on City of Sharonville residents. Statistics on usage only tell part of the tale; we are also involved with assisting individuals after they have overdosed. For those impacted in Sharonville and others in the region, we are active in Hamilton County's Heroin Coalition Quick Response Team. The Quick Response Team is comprised of a police officer and an addiction counselor who make a follow-up visit to the overdose patient and offer addiction treatment, services and support. The Hamilton County QRT sees success 54 percent of the time they are able to get in touch with a person they're trying to help.

Although the opioid crisis is impacting all layers of society, as the numbers above show, the impact to the Police and Fire services to our community has been significantly less than many others in our area have experienced.


POLICE DEPARTMENT

FUTURE OF THE DEPARTMENT TAKING SHAPE

You may have noticed that Sharonville Police Department is flourishing as of late! Not only is our new building, located at 3639 E Kemper Rd, scheduled to open this summer, but you may also notice a few new friendly faces on our department as well. Since June 2019, we have hired FOUR new officers to our department! These new hires put our department at its full complement of forty for the first time since the end of 2017.

We take great pride in properly training our officers to best serve our community. New officers needing OPOTA (Ohio Police Officer Training Academy) certification are sent to Ohio State Highway Patrol's police academy in Columbus. After obtaining their certification, new Sharonville Police Officers will then undergo a comprehensive 18-week Field Training here at the Sharonville Police Department. Those 18 weeks are broken down into subsections/phases in order to support new officers' success in each area. The first 3 weeks of Field Training are spent in the Classroom phase learning Policy/Procedure, computer operating systems such as RCIC/NCIC and our in-house database, Defensive Tactics, Handcuffing and Traffic Stops. Afterword officers undergo a week of Observation time, six weeks of Coaching, six weeks of Patrol and an additional 2-week Shadow phase.

Our new officers are sent through each phase of training, while rotating through several Field Training Officers (FTO). FTOs are made up of our senior patrol. Those currently working with our new officers are Officers Asbrock, Haynes, Muse and Otte. They have a combined 34+ years of experience in Sharonville alone. Please be sure to say hello and welcome our newest officers – Zach Jones, Nicholas Livingston, Mark Mrosek and Ross Siefring!

Filing Due Dates for 2019

Individual Returns: On or before April 15, 2020

Net Profit Business Returns: On or before **April 15, 2020** or the 15th day of the 4th month following the end of the fiscal year.

Withholding Reconciliations: On or before February 29, 2020



DO I NEED TO FILE A TAX RETURN?

The answer is yes if any of the following apply:

- You are a resident of Sharonville 18 years old or older, regardless of your income level.
- You are under 18 years old and have earned income.
- You are a non-resident who works within the City of Sharonville and your income is not fully withheld by an employer.
- You are engaged in a business within the City of Sharonville and have sales, perform services or own rental property, whether or not tax is due.
- Your business is located within or doing business within the City of Sharonville.

WHAT DO I NEED TO BRING WITH ME OR SEND IN WITH MY SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

- 1. W-2 form(s)
- 2. Federal 1040 tax return including:
- Schedule 1, C, E, F and/or 4797 if applicable
- Documentation for any income reported on your Federal tax form as "other income" (line 8 on the Federal 1040 Schedule 1 form)
- Any other federal schedules or forms which document deductions or additions to your local tax return
- Copies of other local tax returns or refund requests you've filed

Why Do I Have to Include My Federal 1040 Form?

All cities in the State of Ohio require a copy of your federal 1040 form to be included with your local tax return. This helps us assure we have all the necessary paperwork and are taxing & giving credits for the correct amounts.

How Do I Pay My Tax?

- If you E-file, payment may be made by ACH or credit card within the website as you complete your return.
- Check or money order payments may be mailed in and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.
- Payments may also be made through Official Payments either online or by phone at 1-800-487-4567.

Note: All credit card payments will incur a fee by the processing company.

How Can I Get an Extension?

If you have received a federal extension to file, you automatically can have an extension with the City of Sharonville until October 15, 2020. A copy of the extension must accompany the filed tax return to avoid penalties. If you do not apply for a federal extension you may request an extension in writing with our office by April 15, 2020. Please remember that an extension to file does not give you an extension to pay your taxes, so be sure to make all payments by April 15th.

WHAT INCOME IS TAXABLE?

- Qualifying wages are defined by the IRS tax code section 3121(a). It includes many different types of income, including but not limited to wages, sick pay, vacation pay, commissions, severance pay, settlements, bonuses, fringe benefits, shortterm disability pay, stock options and deferred compensation. It is usually found in Box 5 (Medicare wages) on your W-2, however there are some exceptions.
- Other income (generally listed on line 8 of your Federal 1040 Schedule 1) such as gambling winnings, HSA and scholarship distributions, director's fees, jury duty income and prize winnings.
- The net of all profit and losses from profession and/or business operations.

WHAT INCOME IS EXEMPT FROM TAX?

- Interest, dividends, some royalties
- Capital gains (unless considered ordinary income)
- Alimony
- Military pay and allowances
- Proceeds from qualified IRS defined retirement plans
- Social Security benefits, welfare benefits, unemployment insurance benefits, workers' compensation

This information regarding income is not all encompassing. Please contact our office if you have questions regarding the taxability of specific types of income.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties.

If you owe less than \$200, but still wish to make estimated payments please note this on your tax return.

Second quarter estimate payments are due by June 15, 2020. For your convenience a coupon was sent with your 2019 tax return. Invoices will be sent for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2020 and January 15, 2021.

Do I GET CREDIT FOR PAYING OTHER CITIES?

Yes, credit for taxes withheld or paid to another municipality is available to residents. It is limited to 1.5% of the amount of W-2 wages taxed to another municipality, and no amounts exceeding the 1.5% limit will be credited toward additional taxable income. Credits for taxes paid for business income are also limited to 1.5% and are pro-rated based on percentage of total business income. Documentation is required for any credit. There are no credits given for county, mental health, or school taxes paid.

NET OPERATING LOSSES FOR 2019 TAX RETURNS

Residents with Business Income: Unused losses allocated to Sharonville from tax year 2016 may still be used at 100% to offset any 2019 profits; however due to changes in State law your 2017 & 2018 losses will be limited to the lesser of 50% of the 2017 and 2018 losses or your net profit. There is a form to help you calculate the allowable deduction on the back of the Sharonville IR tax form.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years. For further information on the collection and payment of property taxes, please contact either the Hamilton County Auditor's office at (513) 946-4000 or the Butler County Auditor's office at (513) 887-3154. SCHOOL DISTRICT TAX

The City of Sharonville is within the Princeton City School District. The code for state income tax form purposes is 3116.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PLAN APPROVED

The City of Sharonville recently completed its first ever Safe Routes to School Plan in conjunction with the Princeton City School District. In mid-2019, the City of Sharonville engaged Kleingers Associates and Murphy Epson Consultants to lead the City of Sharonville in the preparation of a Safe Routes to School (SRTS) Travel Plan for the Princeton City School District elementary and middle school facilities located within the City of Sharonville. In order to apply for funding, an Ohio Department of Transportation approved SRTS Plan is a required pre-requisite to be eligible to apply for Safe Routes to School funding through the Ohio Department of Transportation. The City assembled a SRTS Team comprised of city staff representing different departments, Princeton School District officials and the professional engineering and outreach services of the consultant team to prepare the draft SRTS plan.



The vision for the City of Sharonville and Princeton Community Middle, Sharonville and Stewart Elementary Schools' School Travel Plan is to design programs and implement public improvements which will benefit students and residents through boosting partnerships, encourage walking and biking, promote education about active transportation, enhance quality of life, foster community pride and enhance overall safety. Now that the plan is complete, the City of Sharonville and Princeton City School District will meet the required pre-requisite to be eligible to apply for competitive Safe Routes to School funding through the Ohio Department of Transportation to improve public safety for its students and residents.

The Ohio Department of Transportation Safe Routes to School Program is a competitive grant program that funds safety improvements such as sidewalks, crosswalks and signage among other safety enhancements. The program is competitive and any local government with an approved SRTS Plan is eligible to apply.

SHARONVILLE'S HOME IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

The City of Sharonville has partnered again in 2020 with People Working Cooperatively (PWC) to continue the Home Improvement Program.

General Program Guidelines

- Must be a <u>resident homeowner</u> of the City of Sharonville
- Resident homeowner must meet income guidelines (see chart)
- Owner occupied structure
- Structure must be primary residence.
- City grant limited to \$2,500 unless City allows an exception
- City funding is limited to exterior repairs only

The City of Sharonville Home Improvement Program is FREE for those who qualify, but funds are limited.

No Short-Term Rentals Allowed in the City of Sharonville



SINGLE FAMILY SHORT-TERM RENTAL BAN

Did you know the City of Sharonville has regulations against the short-term rental of single family properties? In the summer of 2019, the City of Sharonville reviewed and approved the regulation of short-term rentals. The City desires to protect the health, safety, welfare, and quality of life of neighborhoods while preserving existing single family residential structures in Sharonville. As a result, a ban on short-term rentals was implemented in order to maintain quiet, clean, orderly, safe and stable single family residential neighborhoods in the City.

Short-term rentals are defined as a residential structure or part thereof, located in any single family area of the City of Sharonville, which is leased or rented for a period of 30 or fewer calendar days in length. If a person violates this chapter/ ordinance, they are guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined up to one hundred dollars (\$100.00); any such violation shall constitute a separate offense on each successive day continued. The legislation on short-term rentals is outlined in part seven of the Business Regulation Code Chapter 714. The Business Regulation Code Chapter 714 is not a zoning ordinance therefore short-term rentals are not "grandfathered".

SPRING & SUMMER SERVICES

YARD WASTE

Grass, weeds, twigs, and leaves can be disposed of using one of the following methods:

- Composting on your property.
- Placing yard waste and garden waste in bags or cans at the curb with regular trash collection.
- Separate yard & garden waste from your regular trash and take the yard waste to one of the three recycling drop-off locations for residents of Hamilton County (free service). For more information call YARDWASTE HOTLINE at (513) 946-7755.
- It is against Codified Ordinance 911.13 DUMPING to dump "combustible waste" such as grass or leaves on any public property (i.e. streets). Please do not blow grass clippings or leaves into the street as these waste materials could clog storm drains.

Brush and Special Pick-up Service

- Curbside Brush and Special Pickup is a FREE year round service to residents.
- Residents must call by Friday to be on a list for pick up the following week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular garbage pick-up.



TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available April through October for large trash disposal.
- The truck will be brought to your home or business by 3:00 p.m. and picked up the next morning by 7:30 a.m.
- A release of liability must be signed by the property owner before the truck can be delivered.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend; for businesses \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck.

GOLDEN VIEW ACRES is a 52-unit Senior Citizen Retirement Village located on Greensfelder Lane off Thornview Drive. Eligibility includes at least 57 years of age and a current Sharonville resident for at least one year; or be a parent, grandparent, or sibling of a current Sharonville resident who has resided in the City for one year.

Golden View Acres has both first and second floor units and one and two bedroom apartments. Each apartment has an equipped kitchen with stove and refrigerator, gas heat, hot water, and air conditioning. Tenants pay their own utilities except water. There are coin operated laundry facilities in each of the three buildings. The complex is a "Smoke Free" facility. After signing a lease agreement, THE RENT IS NOT RAISED unless an additional tenant occupies the same apartment or the current tenant moves to another apartment in the complex. At that time, a new rental agreement is drawn up at the current rate.



To be placed on a WAITING LIST to rent an apartment, a written application must be made and a \$50 fee deposited. This fee is refundable when you rent an apartment or request, in writing, to be taken off the Waiting List.

STREET UPDATES

2020 STREET REPAIR PROGRAM

- Includes the replacement of the water main on Burke Ave., Cornell Rd. (Main to Maple), Spinner Ave., Oak St., Ohio Ave.
- Includes curb and sidewalk repairs or replacement and total street re-paving for Burke Ave., Cornell Rd. & Walnut St. (Main to Maple), Spinner Ave., Oak St., Ohio Ave., Sharon Park Ln., Woodward Ln.

INSTALLING A NEW DRIVEWAY

- You must obtain a permit to install a new driveway from the Community Development Department cost is \$40.
- There is no fee or permit required to install a driveway apron. It must be inspected prior to pouring the cement.
- Call Public Works before constructing a driveway or apron for specifications and inspection requirements.

Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID card. This card will be scanned by the "Safe Point" System against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

The entire membership card data base is scanned through the "Safe Point" system twice a year. New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools and parking lots.

Policy for Bringing Guests

A guest is a member-sponsored user of the facility, accompanied by the member at all times. Please check your guest in at the customer service desk upon entry. Guests 18 years and older must provide one of the following forms of ID: valid driver's license, state ID or passport.

Guest Passes

We offer two different types of guest passes on a daily basis: Basic & Premium. All guests must enter the facility with an existing member. The Basic Guest Pass includes the outdoor pools, indoor track, tennis courts, and gymnasium. The fee is **\$4.00** per day with a \$5 discount if you purchase 5 in advance (\$15) and a \$15 discount if you purchase 10 in advance (\$25). The Premium Guest Pass includes the same facilites as the basic guest, as well as the Fitness Center. The fee is **\$8.00** per day with a \$10 discount if you purchase 5 in advance (\$30) and a \$30 discount if you purchase 10 in advance (\$50).

Refund Policy

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances, if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. (A doctor's note may be required.) Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.

Stay & Play Zone


