Message from the Mayor



Back in the Winter of 2021, I shared with you our City's recently passed Comprehensive Plan. It identified five themes that the City would strive to work toward. It seems fitting to take a minute to share some of the things we've accomplished in meeting those goals.

PURSUE RESPONSIBLE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ... This past year, Council approved a new zoning code that addressed deficiencies in the old Code and clarified our rules and expectations for residents and businesses.

CAPITALIZE ON OUR ECONOMIC MOMENTUM ... Despite a pandemic that ravaged many businesses and other jurisdictions, Sharonville has stayed strong economically and we are poised to continue our economic vitality. One way we have remained so strong is by engaging experts to help us analyze risks and prepare for potential problems.

IMPROVE CONNECTIVITY ... If you haven't been on Kemper Road lately between Route 42 and Sharon Woods, you should. A new sidewalk is installed with more to come. Next up is sidewalk from North of our historic downtown, up Route 42 to Kemper Road. We continue to explore options that encourage walking throughout our City.

ENHANCE COMMUNITY AMENITIES ... The splash pad at Gorman Park was a true hit with families all this Summer. The next phases of that Park transformation will include a dog park, additional shelter, walking path, and a great lawn for play.

RE-DEFINE A VISION FOR OUR PLACES ... Construction will begin soon on our downtown Loop square. It is set to be a significant transformation that includes a water feature, seating areas, and a small performance stage – a true gathering place for our community.

WHAT CAN THE CITY DO ABOUT ALL OF THOSE STOPPED TRAINS?

I started on Sharonville City Council in January 2016 and, without a doubt, the issue that I have been asked about more often than any other is whether the city can do anything about trains that stop at a grade crossing and thereby impede traffic.



When I began my tenure as Director of Law at the beginning of this year, I started tracking a case pending before the Supreme Court of Ohio known as *State of Ohio v. CSX Transportation, Inc.* This case was decided by the Supreme Court on August 17, 2022, and the news is unfortunate for municipalities in Ohio that have train crossing problems. Five of the Supreme Court justices held that a railroad operating in Ohio cannot be held liable for violating Ohio Revised Code 5589.21 which is the code section that penalizes railroad companies for obstructing public roadways for more than five minutes.

Basically, the Supreme Court opined that the Interstate Commerce Commission Termination Act expressly preempts other federal and state laws in conflict with the act. The Interstate Commerce Commission Termination Act (also known as the ICC Termination Act) is a federal law enacted by Congress in 1995 that, among other things, abolished the Interstate Commerce Commission and created its successor agency, the Surface Transportation Board. The act also granted the board exclusive jurisdiction over "transportation by rail carriers" (Section 10501 of Title 49 of the United States Code, also known as 49 U.S.C. 10501).

The Supreme Court held that "[be]cause R.C. 5589.21 regulates, manages, and governs rail traffic in this state by prescribing how long a train may stay stopped while blocking a crossing, it conflicts with and is expressly preempted by the Termination Act." So, for all those who would like Sharonville to do something to stop the railroad companies from blocking grade crossings in our city, I share your frustrations and concerns.

Our elected officials and administration will continue to work with the railroad companies that operate within our city to smooth transportation problems but this decision from our state's Supreme Court eliminates potential leverage to force these companies to be good corporate neighbors. I urge you to contact your elected representative to Congress and ask them to amend federal law allowing local municipalities to stop railroad companies from blocking our roads. Until then we all have to use extra patience when stopped at the tracks!

WHAT ARE THE ESTIMATE TAX DUE DATES?

Invoices will be sent this year for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2022 and January 17, 2023. Failure to pay at least 90% of your 2022 tax liability by January 17, 2023 may result in a 15% penalty.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld, they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties. If you owe less than \$200 but still wish to make estimate payments please note this on your tax return.

DID YOU FORGET TO FILE YOUR SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN?

Please file as soon as possible. Mail your return or stop by our office for assistance. Continuing to delay filing will only increase possible penalties.

EXPECTING A REFUND?

Refunds are processed in the order received. You should expect a check to arrive within 90 days.

HOW DO I PAY MY TAX?

- Bi-monthly invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due, please call.
- Check or money order payments may be mailed in or placed in the secure drop box by our front door and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".
- Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.
- Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. **ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.*

RECEIVED A LETTER ASKING FOR MORE DOCUMENTS?

If we didn't receive all the required documents (W-2s or federal forms), a request is sent to verify the data on your tax return. Please send the requested information in as soon as possible so your tax return can be completed. Failure to send in these documents can result in lost credits, late filing fees, or additional charges if a payment is subsequently due.

FILED A FEDERAL EXTENSION?

All 2021 local tax returns with a Federal extension are due by October 17, 2022. A copy of the extension should accompany the filed tax return to avoid a late filing fee. Extensions only extend the time allowed to file a tax return, they do not extend the payment due dates.

Working from Home?

For 2021:

If you worked from home during the tax year 2021, but had local tax withheld to another location, you may be eligible for a refund of that tax. If a refund is requested, your tax credit on line 8 of our IR form will be reduced and a balance will be due to Sharonville. Please attach a copy of the refund request with your Sharonville return.

For 2022:

If you are working from your Sharonville residence 100% of the time or on a hybrid schedule, your employer is generally required to withhold 1.5% of your wages and remit those taxes to the Sharonville Tax Office. There are some exceptions; we are happy to discuss your personal situation with you.

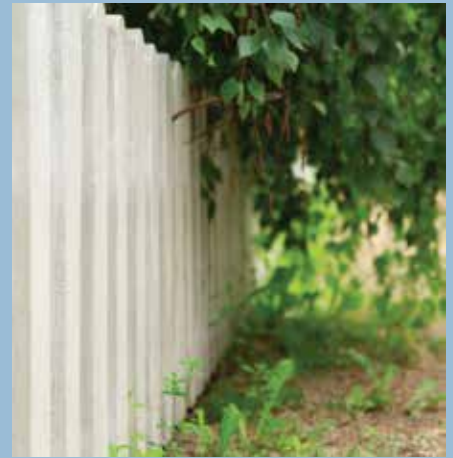

TREE MAINTENANCE & PRIVATE PROPERTY

- The City of Sharonville often receives questions and complaints about trees and vegetation on private property. The city does not have ordinances or regulations regarding trees on private property other than a requirement that they do not obstruct a public sidewalk.
- The City of Sharonville recommends arranging for the removal of dying or dead trees to mitigate the potential for damage to life and/or property.
- Disputes over trees and vegetation along property lines are best resolved through communication and collaboration between the affected property owners.
- Please be considerate to neighbors regarding the disposal of leaves and other yard debris following mowing, pruning, raking or blowing.
- Yard waste is collected on the same day as your regular garbage collection. The city recommends placing yard and garden waste in bags or cans and placing at the curb for collection.
- The brush pickup is a free service offered by the city. See the Public Works information on the following page or call 513-563-1177 for more information.



PROPERTY MAINTENANCE REMINDERS

The City of Sharonville strives for desirable and sightly neighborhoods for not only its residents but also visitors and potential new residents. Vacant and poorly maintained private property may result in lower property values, health and safety concerns, and potential property maintenance and/or zoning violations. Below are reminders regarding the most common property maintenance violations and complaints the city receives.

Inoperable/Junk vehicles



Inoperable/junk vehicles may not be stored in the driveway or out in the open. They must be stored in a fully enclosed building if kept on the property.

Accumulation of Junk or Rubbish



Accumulation of junk or rubbish cannot be kept or maintained in a driveway or alongside of any house or accessory building.

Parked Vehicles



Vehicles must be parked on a paved surface, asphalt or concrete, not in the yard.

SEASONAL REMINDERS

FALL:

- There is no leaf pick up program in the City of Sharonville – raking leaves into the street gutters is not permitted.
- Raking leaves into the gutter causes catch basins to back up and flood streets. Rake and bag leaves for pick up and disposal with Rumpke on your trash days. Rumpke has a 10 item limit.
- If you have a storm culvert that runs along your property line or under your driveway, it is the homeowner's responsibility to keep these culverts and the inlets clear of leaves and debris. Clogged culverts affect drainage upstream and flooding on roadways and surrounding areas.

WINTER:

- During a snowstorm, do NOT park vehicles on the street. Cars parked on the street create additional obstacles and restrict visibility. Parking your vehicle in your driveway allows for a more complete clearing of your street. Wherever practical, we will attempt to keep the snow build-up to a minimum. We are unable to remove plowed snow from in front of driveways. This is the responsibility of the property owner and/or tenant. Do not shovel snow into the street.
- Older residents and those with health problems are reminded to avoid physical activity associated with shoveling snow.
- Stay at least two car lengths behind a snow plow for every 10 mph you are traveling. Never cut in between a caravan of plows clearing a road.
- Beware of black ice, roads that look wet but actually are glazed with ice. Ramps and bridges freeze first.
- Winter weather brings potholes and other unsafe conditions. Please notify Public Works of any curb, street, sidewalk or storm drainage problems in the City. The Public Works Department will attempt to correct the safety problems in a timely manner.

BRUSH AND SPECIAL PICK-UP SERVICE

- Curbside brush and special pickup is a FREE year-round service (unless it is snowing and we are treating the roads) to residents.
- Residents must call **before 5:00 p.m. Friday** to have their address put on a list for pick up the following week. Have the materials out for removal on Sunday evening of the requested service week.
- Brush chipping is limited to 15 minutes per stop. If there is additional debris left after 15 minutes, residents must call to get their name on the list for the next week.
- Twigs cannot be picked up. They are yard waste and must be disposed of with your regular trash collection.

TRUCK LOAN PROGRAM

- Available until October 28th for 2022 for large trash disposal.
- Cost for homeowners is \$50 a night and \$60 for the weekend. For businesses, it is \$90 for nights and weekends.
- Call to schedule a truck.

DISPOSAL REMINDERS

- Please keep lids on trash cans at all times. Lids help keep rain water out of the cans making them manageable to handle for trash collection. Please make sure cans have useable handles.
- Refrigerators, freezers and other appliances that contain chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) refrigerants must have the CFC removed from the appliance by a Certified Technician. Attach documentation from the technician to the appliance verifying that the CFC has been removed. Call RUMPKE at 513-851-0122 a day in advance of your normal trash pickup day to notify them of an appliance pick up. There is paperwork on Rumpke's website (rumpke.com) that needs to be taped to the appliance.
- Couches, chairs, mattresses and box springs MUST be wrapped in plastic and sealed tight with tape at the curb for normal trash pickup. Call RUMPKE at 513-851-0122 a day in advance to notify them of a large item pickup.



- Computers, televisions, fluorescent bulbs and hazardous waste cannot be placed at the curb for Rumpke trash collection. The Hamilton County and Butler County Recycling and Solid Waste Districts can help you with disposal of electronic and hazardous waste items for homeowners ONLY. Fluorescent bulbs can be taken to hardware stores (Home Depot, Lowes, and Menards) for proper disposal. WHAT IS CARBON MONOXIDE?

Carbon monoxide is an odorless colorless gas that can lead to serious illness and in extreme cases death. Carbon Monoxide (CO) is generated through burning any fossil fuel. This includes cars or trucks, small engines, gas stoves, lanterns, grills, gas fireplaces, gas ranges or furnaces. CO can build up indoors and poison people and animals who breath it.

Common symptoms of CO poisoning are headache, dizziness, weakness, upset stomach, vomiting, chest pain and confusion. These are often associated as "flu like" symptoms. Everyone is at risk for CO, but the very young, elderly and people with chronic ailments are more likely to get sick from CO.

To assist with prevention, install a CO detector in your home. Carbon Monoxide detectors come in various shapes and sizes. Some are battery operated while others plug into a wall outlet with battery backup. We generally recommend the type that plug in with a battery backup. If battery operated, replace your battery in the spring and fall when you replace your smoke detector batteries. Have your heating system, water heater and any other gas, oil or coal burning appliances serviced by a qualified technician every year. Any home improvement retail store sells these unit from \$15-\$45 dollars and have very easy-to-use instructions.



To avoid CO poisoning from your car or truck, never run your vehicle for any length of time in your garage even with the garage door open. Also, never run generators or any other small engine in your garage for the same reasons.

DRONE TEAMS

The Sharonville Fire Department works closely with the Hamilton County USAR (Urban Search and rescue) and has several members that are active with this team. A recent tool that was added to the USAR availabilities is a drone component with trained pilots. SFD has one of five Flight Team Leaders that leads a team of eight drone pilots. The flight teams will be called to action to provide an additional perspective and as a force multiplier in many scenarios that include lost or missing people, structural firefighting incidents and natural disasters such as tornados and flooding.

POLICE DEPARTMENT



CALLS FOR SERVICE

Sharonville Police respond to over 1,000 crash-related calls for service every year. Additionally, there are usually 500-700 estimated traffic related calls for service. These usually involve disabled vehicles, flat tires, traffic light problems, and road debris. Last year about 11% of all calls for service were related to traffic issues. Because of Sharonville's central location and the amount of major thoroughfare interchanges, traffic response is a major component to policing in Sharonville.

Sharonville Police have also purchased several new speed monitoring signs. These signs educate motorists by warning if they are over the posted speed limit. Not only are they a live response, but they also collect data for us to evaluate later. By looking at traffic counts, average speeds, and the number of potential speeding offenses, we can validate neighborhood complaints and direct patrols to the area.



Did You Know?

Major arterial roadways in Sharonville see a tremendous amount of traffic. For example, Lebanon Rd near E Kemper Rd sees upwards of 20,000 cars pass through on average every day. You can research traffic counts in our town and others by looking at the Ohio Department of Transportation's website under "traffic monitoring".

Expansion coming 2023!

The Sharonville Convention Center expansion continues to move forward. We are breaking ground on the project this month, doubling the size of the Todd Portune exhibition hall. This remarkable space will be able to accommodate and feed up to **2,000** guests and will allow for the number of trade show booths to double to **200**.

The expansion is estimated to be a 12 to 14 month project and will be ready for guests **summer of 2023**. Our expansion is coming at just the right time and fulfilling a strong marketplace need. We believe our expansion project will nearly double the direct and indirect spending in our area. We historically

attract over **300,000** attendees annually and we're expecting that number to double within five years; a significant economic impact to all of our businesses and stakeholders.

In addition to the expansion, the project will include a full kitchen, restaurant, sports bar, an admission ticket window, first aid room, additional restrooms, more entrances, and additional parking. The new convention hall will be named Todd Portune Hall after the former Hamilton County commissioner. Many opportunities await you at the Sharonville Convention Center. We'll continue to keep you up-to-date on the exciting progress!

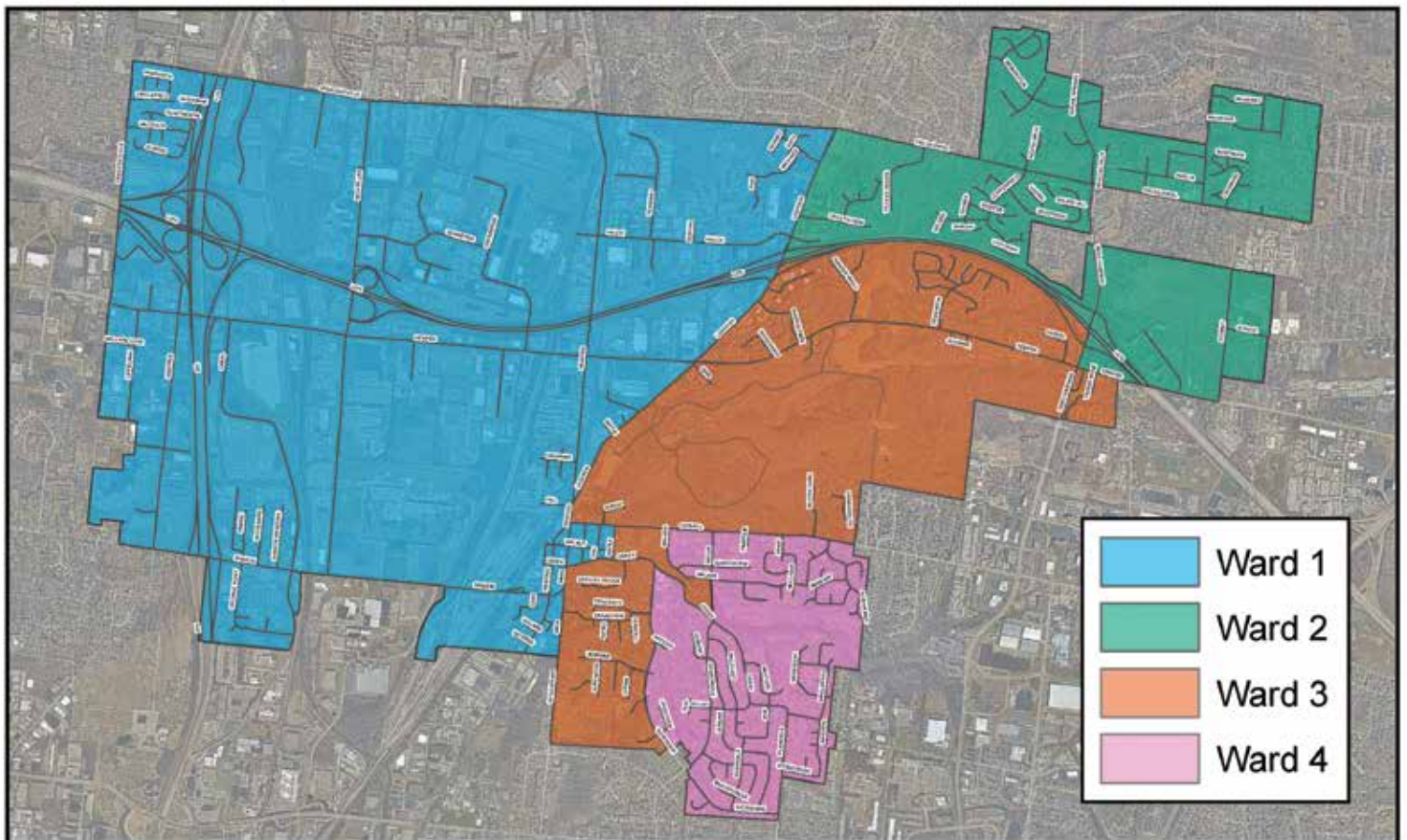

ENERGY AGGREGATION UPDATE

Natural Gas:

The City's program with IGS currently has variable pricing that changes month to month. We will look to fix a price for the winter once the summer heat passes and (historically) the forward market trends down. Since January, the program has averaged 18.4% savings over Duke utility's residential gas supply price.

Electric:

The City's program with Energy Harbor has a fixed rate of 4.72 cents per kWh for carbon free energy until December 2023. Since January, the program has averaged 39.6% savings over Duke utility's residential electric supply price.

Recreation Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID card. This card will be scanned by the "Watch List" System against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.

Guest Policy *Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five grandchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- **Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.**

Refund Policy

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances (a doctor's note may be required), if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.

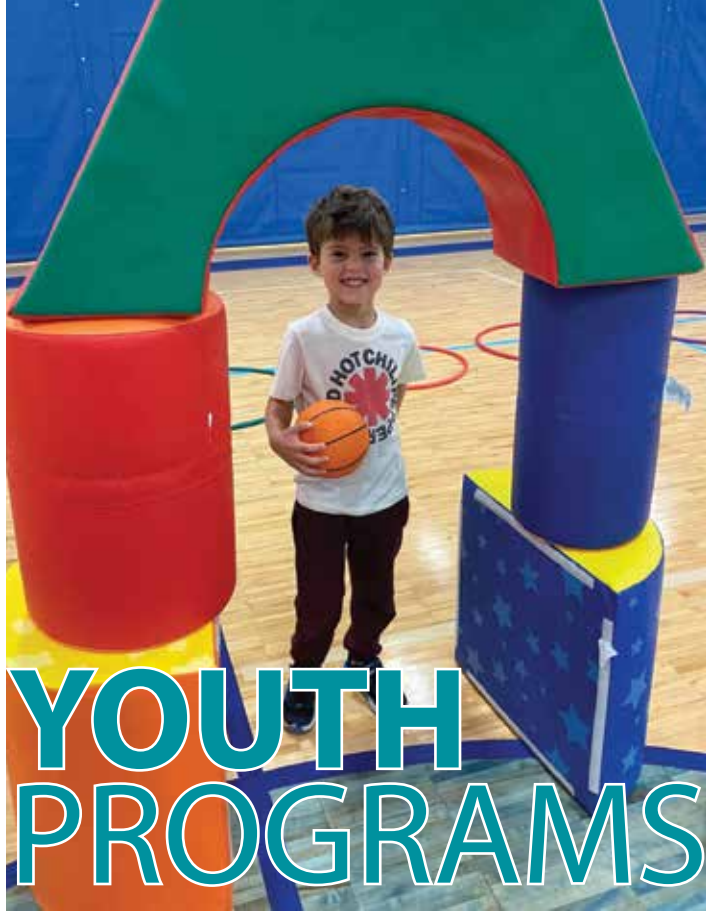
