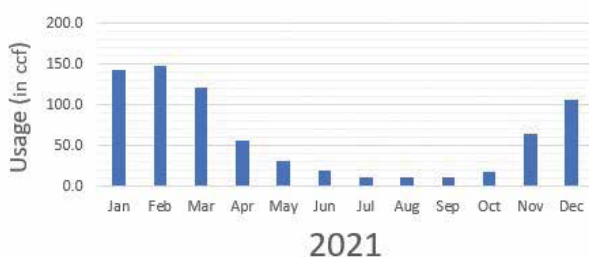
THE NATURAL GAS MARKET IS INCREASING AND VOLATILE RIGHT NOW, WHAT DOES THAT MEAN FOR THE CITY'S GAS AGGREGATION PROGRAM?

The City's Natural Gas Aggregation program has enjoyed a low fixed price for the past three years. With that program and its pricing ending in June 2022, the City has been working closely with its energy advisors to determine the best option for its renewed program offering.

With the sudden and steep increase in forward natural gas prices over the past six months, now is not the right time to lock into long-term fixed pricing. Rather, the City has extended its agreement with IGS Energy for 12 months under a variable pricing structure – meaning that pricing beginning with July bills will vary month-to-month and be based on current market conditions. This provides several timely advantages. First, we avoid committing to a high fixed price for a 1-3 year term during a historic and unusually high market. Second, under this agreement, the City has the opportunity and flexibility to quickly lock in a price, each month or for a longer term, if the market takes a momentary dip or trends lower for a longer period. Lastly, it allows time for future market conditions to improve, and since we are in the summer months when gas usage is extremely low - a typical home in Sharonville uses just about 7% of its annual gas from July through October - current market pricing should have a minimal overall impact on individual bills. The plan for the summer is to monitor the market closely and lock in pricing when conditions are favorable with an ultimate goal of securing reasonable and stable pricing for the winter and beyond.

In 2021, the Gas Aggregation program saved participating residents more than \$151,000 and small businesses more than \$42,000. Way to go!

The new program Opt-out letters should be received in homes by mid-June. Please read the material carefully and make your decision. If you wish to participate in the aggregation, you do not need to take any action and as always may return to Duke Energy at any time without penalty or cancellation fees. If you choose to opt-out, your account will automatically be returned to Duke Energy.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS IN HIGH WATERS

Powerful, intense storms can create high water on roadways and flash flooding. Please remember the following safety reminders when encountering high water.

- Do not attempt to drive through high water or standing water. It is not safe. You and your vehicle could be swept away.
- Do not ignore road closure and high water signs. They are there for your safety.
- Do not get out of your vehicle and try to walk through the flood waters. It's important if you get stuck to stay in your car.
- Manhole covers can come off during a flood and can actually be draining below the water surface unseen.
- If you do get stuck, call 911.

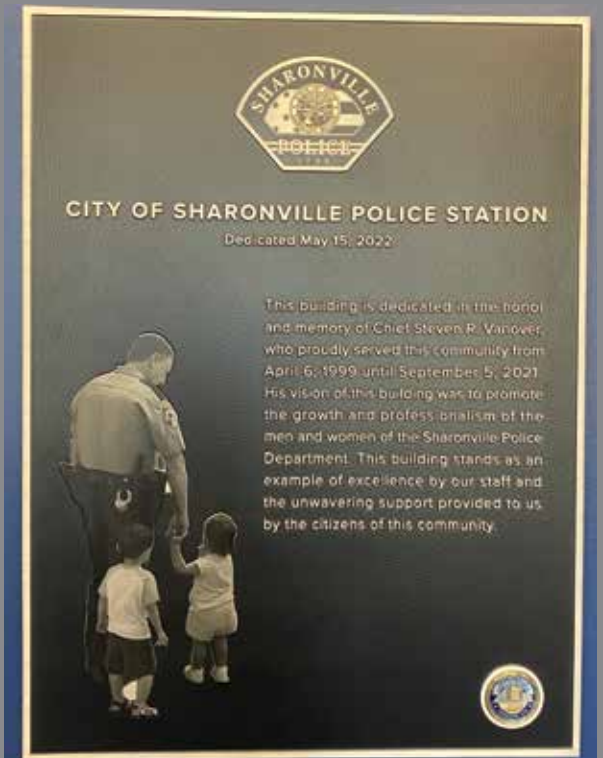
POLICE STATION DEDICATION

On Sunday May 15th, 2022 the Sharonville Police Station was dedicated to the late Police Chief Steve Vanover. FIREWORKS SAFETY TIPS



- Never allow young children to play with or ignite fireworks.
- Avoid buying fireworks that are packaged in brown paper because this is often a sign the fireworks were made for professional displays, and they could pose a danger to consumers.
- Always have an adult supervise fireworks activities. Young children can suffer injuries from sparklers. Sparklers burn at temperatures of about 2,000 degrees.
- Never place any part of your body directly over a fireworks device when lighting the fuse. Back up to a safe distance immediately after lighting fireworks.
- Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishap.
- Light fireworks one at a time, then move back quickly.
- Never carry fireworks in a pocket or shoot them off in metal or glass containers.
- After fireworks complete their burning, douse the spent device with plenty of water from a bucket or hose before discarding it to prevent a trash fire.
- Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them.
- Be respectful of your neighbors. Late night fireworks displays are not always appreciated by those who are trying to sleep. Make sure to pick up the debris left behind. What goes up, must come down and it's usually in somebody else's yard!

The first three phases of the Sharonville Downtown Loop Master Plan for Depot Square, Creek Road, and Walnut Street are underway!

The tentative schedule is as follows:

- May 20, 2022 – Legal Notice to Paper
- May 27, 2022 – Out to Bid (3-week bid period)
- June 17, 2022 – Bid Opening
- June 21, 2022 – Council Meeting to approve contract
- May 2023 – Substantial Completion

IMPORTANT STORM WATER INFORMATION

If you live in a platted residential subdivision, there is a high chance your property is associated with permanent storm water drainage facilities. These facilities may include storm water detention basins, channels, and drainage swales that must be maintained by the property owner or Homeowners Associations (HOA). The purpose is to effectively transmit storm water away from home foundations towards approved storm water drainage areas. Drainage swales are typically located along common side or rear property lines.

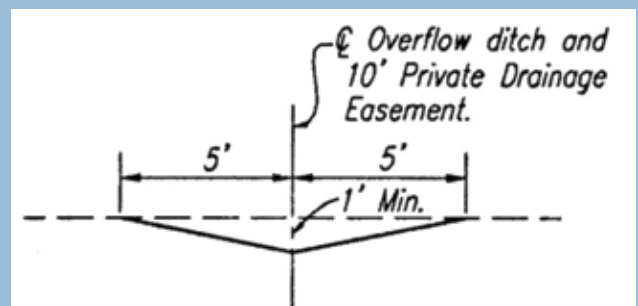
Storm water drainage issues are a common complaint received by the City from private land owners. Property owners may not be aware that the installation of detached garages, sheds, walkways, driveways, swimming pools, and even landscaping can change the approved permanent storm drainage facility design on a property and create a headache for neighbors. These approved drainage facilities are private and must be maintained by the property owner or HOA.

It is important that property owners be conscious of these approved drainage facilities. If you modify or block a drainage swale or change the direction of natural flow, you may be responsible and liable for damage caused on another property.

Basic Rules to Remember:

- No mechanical (sump) pumps are allowed to be tied to the downspout lines that discharge through an underground pipe to the public street, curb, or within 15 feet of a property line. Permits are required for the installation of sump pump drainage lines and are issued by the Plumbing Division of the Hamilton County Public Health Department #513-946-7800.
- Do not enclose existing drainage swales into a pipe. Drainage swales are designed to be open. By concentrating the storm water flow in a pipe, you could damage neighboring properties. It is better to work with your neighbors to find a solution for any water problems. Open swales are the best environmental solution to storm water when the storm water infiltrates or drains away within 24 hours.

- All drains, gutters and downspouts shall be connected to storm sewers; if they are unavailable, they should be connected to street gutters. If neither is available, then they shall be connected to the natural drainage of the lot.
- Keep the drainage swale clear of brush and logs. Never put leaves, mulch, or grass clippings in or near a stream or drainage swale.
- Never plant trees or install landscaping in an approved storm water drainage swale.

IF YOU FORGOT TO FILE YOUR SHARONVILLE TAX RETURN

We suggest you file as soon as possible. You can still mail the return, or stop by our office for assistance. Continuing to delay filing will only increase possible penalties.

EXPECTING A REFUND?

Refunds are processed in the order received. You should expect a check to arrive within 90 days.

RECEIVED A LETTER ASKING FOR MORE DOCUMENTS?

If we didn't receive all the required documents (W-2s or federal forms), a request is sent to verify the data on your tax return. Please send the requested information in as soon as possible so your tax return can be completed. Failure to send in these documents can result in lost credits, late filing fees, or additional charges if a payment is subsequently due.

EXTENSION DUE DATE

All local tax returns with a Federal extension are due by October 15, 2022. A copy of the extension should accompany the filed tax return. Extensions only extend the time allowed to file a tax return, they do not extend the payment due dates.

AM I REQUIRED TO PAY ESTIMATED TAXES?

All individuals and businesses that reasonably expect to owe \$200 or more due to taxable income, after subtracting credits from withholding by an employer, are required to estimate and pay the tax during the year the income is earned.

If you owe less than \$200 but still wish to make estimated payments you may do so at any time. You may increase or decrease your estimated taxes at any time by notifying us in writing.

2nd quarter payments were due by June 15, 2022. Invoices will be sent twice this year for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2022 and January 17, 2023. Failure to pay at least 90% of your 2022 tax liability by January 17, 2023 may result in a 15% penalty.

HOW DO I PAY MY TAX?

Bi-monthly invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due please call, we're happy to help.

Check or money order payments may be mailed in and should be made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax".

Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.

Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online (a link is available on our website Sharonville.org) or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. **The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.**

SHARONVILLE RESIDENTS RECYCLED 708 TONS IN 2021

Congratulations to all the residents who recycled in 2021. On average, each household in Sharonville recycled 354 pounds – that's 14.5% of all waste collected in Sharonville in 2021.

INSTALLING A NEW DRIVEWAY OR APRON

- You must obtain a permit to install a new driveway from the Community Development Department – cost is \$40.
- There is no fee or permit required to install a driveway apron (sidewalk to street). It must be inspected prior to pouring the cement.
- Stop by Public Works before constructing a driveway or apron for specifications and to fill out an inspection request.



SPRING & SUMMER SERVICES CONTINUE

Recreation Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID card. This card will be scanned by the "Watch List" System against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools, and parking lots.

Guest Policy *Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult member, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 guests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five grandchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- **Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.**

Refund Policy

Membership and class refunds will only be given in cases of medical circumstances (a doctor's note may be required), if the member moves, or if the class is canceled. Refunds are obtained by filling out proper paperwork at the Customer Service Desk. Checks will be sent to your residence within four weeks. If paid by a credit card, refunds will be credited back to the card that was used for the transaction.

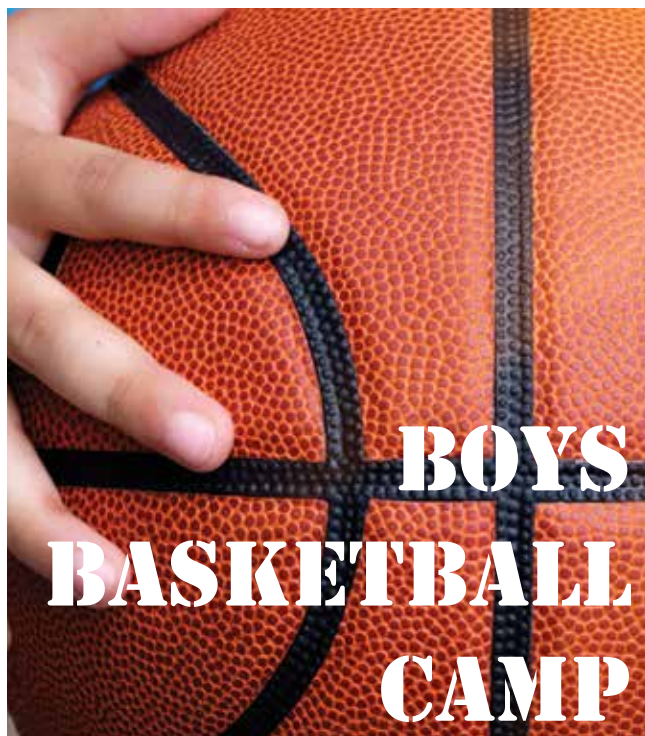
