



Message from the Mayor


Fire fighter-paramedic Jeff Vaughn has served the City of Sharonville for over 20 years. During that entire time and for a decade prior, he has served his country as a member of the United States Air Force rising to the rank of Senior Master Sergeant. At the end of May, SMSgt Vaughn retired after 33-years of service to our country. SMSgt Vaughn's military career included support in Operation Desert Storm, Iraqi Freedom, among several others. Every potential officer in the state of Ohio must pass a 26-week long police academy in order to obtain their certification as a police officer. In Sharonville, once the officer graduates, they endure a 17-week long Field Training program. During this program the new officers have additional classroom training on Sharonville policies, field experience making arrests and traffic stops, and on-going reviews with their training officer. The job has become so complex, it generally takes three to five

years for a new officer to completely master it. During their first few years, officers go to many trainings that involve topics such as report writing, legal updates, criminal and crash investigations.

With many retirements due in the next few years, the biggest focus of the Sharonville Police Department is preparing younger officers to take over those leadership and specialized roles. Recently, Lt. Cordes completed his C.L.E.E. (Certified Law Enforcement Executive) Certification, and Lt. Griffith attended the F.B.I. National Academy. Both schools were extensive and loaded with masters-level courses on leadership, personnel management, resource allocation, and budget management. The skills learned here directly relate to the day-to-day leadership of a large, professional police department.

Additionally, anyone interested in becoming a supervisor at Sharonville Police Department is offered the chance to attend a first-line leadership class. Officers that are promoted to Sergeant typically attend leadership programs put on by the Ohio Association of Chiefs of Police, such as the Supervisor Training and Education program (STEP) and the Police Executive Leadership College (PELC).

The staff at Sharonville PD is driven to develop our people so that we serve Sharonville well and create unique opportunities through the officer's career. Several officers are attending schools to develop their skills in anticipation of assignments for the detective division, as crash investigators, or school resource officers, and to be instructors.

INTERNATIONAL TRAINING METHODS IN SHARONVILLE

Sharonville Fire Department utilizes Blue Card, an international incident management system and tactical method of communication for emergency situations. When this management occurs, the hazard-zone workers become part of the Incident Commanders overall plan. This creates a safer environment for our firefighters through accountability and standard operations. The fire department has committed that all our full-time members will be trained by the end of 2023.



Sharonville has become a training destination for Blue Card:

- Hosted Big Box Workshops which brought in Fire Chiefs from all over the United States for this cutting-edge approach to these fires. The "Big Box" store has gotten bigger. Once, a 150,000 sq ft Wal-Mart Supercenter was a big commercial building. Today, this size of occupancy pales in comparison to the mammoth fulfillment centers that exist all over the country with ranges from 600,000 sq ft to well over 1,000,000 sq ft.
- Hosted a five day train-the-trainer with Chiefs from all over the United States teaching and attending at Station 86. The opportunity for our personnel to interact and learn from them was invaluable.
- Sharonville Convention Center will host the Blue Card Hazard Zone Conference in October. This event will bring in over 500 Executive Level Chiefs from all over the country for best practices in multiple disciplines in hazard zone management.

FIREFIGHTER RETIRES FROM AIR FORCE

Sharonville Fire Department Firefighter Jeff Vaughn retired from the United States Air Force after 33 years of service. He was awarded The Meritorious Service Medal. Senior Master Sergeant Vaughn served with honor directly supporting operations DESERT STORM, ENDURING FREEDOM, IRAQI FREEDOM, NEW DAWN, FREEDOM SENTINEL, INHERENT RESOLVE, and the Resolute Support Mission. AMERICAN LUNG ASSOCIATION'S FIGHT FOR AIR CLIMB

Sharonville Fire Department and Local 4498 members participated in the Fight For Air Climb to support ALA's mission to defeat lung cancer, create a tobacco free future, champion for clean air for all, and improve the quality of life for those living with lung disease. The 2023 event was held for a third year in a row at Great American Ballpark after being at Carew Tower for several years.





SAFETY - PEDIATRIC VEHICULAR HEATSTROKE

With temperatures beginning to rise, it seems appropriate to talk about making every effort to avoid a very preventable tragedy - pediatric vehicular heatstroke. Simply put, this is when a child is left in a hot car and suffers heatstroke, sometimes resulting in death.

Here are a few facts about pediatric vehicular heatstroke recognized by National Highway Traffic Safety Administration:

- Since 1998, over 940 children have died due to being left in or trapped in a hot car.
- In these cases:
- 53% the caregiver forgot that the child was in the vehicle. 25% the child gained access to the vehicle on their own. 20% the caregiver knowingly left the child in the vehicle. 2% the circumstances are unknown. All of these tragedies could have been avoided.
- The children's ages range from just 5 days old to 14 years of age with 54% of these tragedies involving children under the age of 2.
- Children are more vulnerable to heatstroke due to their body temperatures rising 3-5 times quicker than adults.
- Heatstroke begins when the body's core temperature reaches about 104 degrees.
- A child can die when their body temperature reaches 107 degrees.
- In under 30 minutes, a car can heat up by as much as 40 degrees.

The following are some tips to prevent this unimaginable tragedy:

- Never leave a child in a vehicle unattended. Even if the windows are partially open, the engine is on, or even if the air conditioning is running.
- Make it a habit to check your entire vehicle, front and back, before walking away from your vehicle. Train yourself to PARK, LOOK, LOCK.
- Ask your childcare provider to call if your child doesn't show up when they are expected to.
- Place a personal item such as a purse, briefcase or even your cell phone in the back seat as another reminder to look before you lock and walk away from your vehicle.
- Write a note or place a stuffed animal in the passenger seat to remind you that a child is in the back.
- Store car keys out of reach of children and teach children that in or around a vehicle is not a safe play area.
- Always lock your vehicle so children can't get into an unattended vehicle.
- If you see a distressed child alone in a vehicle, act quickly. Call 911 immediately and get the child out of the vehicle as quickly as you can.

OUTDOOR STORAGE IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS

The Community Development Department often receives complaints about the accumulation and storage of materials on residential properties in the City. The storage of materials out in the open can create unsightly views and negatively impact neighboring properties. Section 1113.09 of the Sharonville Zoning Code entitled PARKING, OPEN STORAGE OF SUPPLIES, MATERIAL & EQUIPMENT, AND ACCUMULATION OF WASTE PROHIBITED lists materials that are not allowed to be stored outside in the open on residential properties. Materials must be located in a fully enclosed building and not visible from street or adjacent property not in an open carport.

The ordinance prohibits the open storage of materials and equipment such as building and construction materials, or lawn equipment, trash, junk, or any scrap materials such as automobile, trailer or vehicle chassis, parts, tires or sections, household appliances, lumber, scrap iron, old metal, rope, plastic, bottles, pipe, conduit, paper/paperboard, Styrofoam, rags, stoves, furniture or other waste materials to remain or accumulate on a residential property.

FLOOD INSURANCE - BASIC INFORMATION

Parts of Sharonville, including existing businesses and residential areas, are located within the FEMA Designated 100 Year Floodplain. Homes and businesses in high-risk flood areas, known as Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA), with mortgages from government-backed lenders are required to have flood insurance.

The US Congress created the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) in 1968 to alleviate the financial burden caused by flooding across the United States. The NFIP is administered nationally by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and enables homeowners, business owners and renters in participating communities to purchase federally-backed flood insurance as protection again flood loss.

Federal disaster assistance does not become available unless a flood event is declared to be a major disaster by the President of the United States. Most forms of federal disaster assistance are loans which must be paid back with interest. Since most homeowners' typical insurance policies do not usually cover flood damage, acquiring and maintaining flood insurance coverage is a practical alternative to help citizens recover from flood losses. The NFIP makes flood insurance available to property owners, renters and businesses in high, moderate, and low flood risk areas. Anyone who has flood insurance coverage that has sustained flood damage can make a claim on their policy regardless of a federal disaster declaration and will be able to recover faster when floodwaters recede.



Sharonville is a participating member of the NFIP so ANYONE residing in a participating community can purchase flood insurance. It is available to all residents, business owners and renters in both high risk and moderate to low-risk areas. Flood insurance can be purchased through a licensed insurance agent or an insurer participating in the NFIP. Flood insurance cannot be purchased directly from the NFIP. If your insurance agent does not sell flood insurance, you can contact the NFIP Referral Call Center at 1-800-427-4661 to request an agent referral.

If You Forgot to File Your Sharonville Tax Return

We suggest you file as soon as possible. You can still mail the return, or stop by our office for assistance. Continuing to delay filing will only increase possible penalties.

EXTENSION DUE DATE

All local tax returns with a Federal extension are due by October 16, 2023. A copy of the extension should accompany the filed tax return. Extensions only extend the time allowed to file a tax return, they do not extend the payment due dates.

ESTIMATE TAX DUE DATES

Invoices will be sent this year for the 3rd and 4th quarter payments which are due on September 15, 2023 and January 16, 2024. Failure to pay at least 90% of your 2023 tax liability by January 16, 2024 may result in a 15% penalty.

WHY DO I HAVE TO PAY ESTIMATE PAYMENTS?

All federal, state, and local taxes are due during the year that income is earned. Most companies withhold federal and state taxes from your paychecks, but they may not withhold local income taxes, or may withhold less tax than our 1.5% rate. If a taxpayer reasonably expects to owe \$200 or more due to not having at least 1.5% local tax withheld they need to make estimate payments or may be charged penalties. If you owe less than \$200 but still wish to make estimate payments please note this on your tax return.

EXPECTING A REFUND?

Refunds are processed in the order received. You should expect a check to arrive within 90 days.

RECEIVED A LETTER ASKING FOR MORE DOCUMENTS?

If we didn't receive all the required documents (W-2s or federal forms), a request is sent to verify the data on your tax return. Please send the requested information in as soon as possible so your tax return can be completed. Failure to send in these documents can result in lost credits, late filing fees, or additional charges if a payment is subsequently due.

How Do I Pay My Tax?

Bi-monthly invoices are sent for all tax balances. If you have questions regarding any balance due please call, we're happy to help.

Check or money order payments made payable to "City of Sharonville Tax" may be mailed or placed in the secure drop box by our front door.

Payments by check, money order, cash, or credit card are accepted at the tax office.

Payments may also be made through ACI Payments either online (a link is available on our website) or by phone at 1-800-487-4567. ACI Payments does charge a nominal fee for this service which may be calculated using the fee calculator available.

If your balance has been sent to the Ohio Attorney General all payments must be paid directly to them at P.O. Box 89471, Cleveland OH, 44101. If you have questions you can contact them at 1-888-871-8838 or visit their web site at www.ohioattorneygeneral.gov.

PROPERTY TAXES

The collections of property taxes (whether it is for residential property or business property) are the responsibility of Hamilton County or Butler County. The City of Sharonville does not receive property tax dollars from city residents or businesses and is proud that a municipal property tax has not been levied in over 30 years.



Community Center Access Policy

Every person entering the Community Center must stop at the Customer Service Desk to state his/her purpose of coming to the Community Center. If you are a member, please make sure to scan your membership card each time you enter the Community Center and Pool. In order to be as safe as possible and pursuant to City of Sharonville Ordinance Number 2014-13, ALL resident and non-resident guests, ages 18 years and older, purchasing a guest pass will be required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID Card. This card will be scanned against the National Sex Offenders Registry.

New members and renewal members joining the Community Center will be scanned before membership cards are given to the members. Should your driver's license or state ID card match a National or State Sexual Offender Registry record or if you do not provide a valid driver's license or state ID card, you will not be permitted to enter the facility. There is an appeal process.

Alcoholic beverages are not permitted on Recreation property without a permit from the Recreation Director. This includes but is not limited to parks, shelters, Community Center, pools and parking lots.



Supervision & Guest Policy

Community Center & Aquatics Facilities

*Guest Fee is \$5 per Person

Our goal in this policy is to accommodate our members as best as we can, without creating a potentially unsafe or unfair usage of the facility.

- Members age 10 & over may enter the Community Center or Pool by themselves. Members under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult member, age 18+.
- The fee for a member to bring a guest is \$5.00 per person. Guests ages 2 & under are not subject to a fee.
- Members ages 10 to 17 are permitted to bring no more than 2 quests per day.
- Adult members over the age of 18 are permitted to bring up to 5 guests per day. If the guests are from the same family as the member, they are permitted to bring more than 5.
- Example: An adult member over the age of 18 is bringing their adult daughter, son in law, and five granchildren from out of town to visit the pool. Since all guests are from the same family as the member, this would be permitted.
- All guests over the age of 18 are required to provide a valid driver's license or state ID to be scanned by our SafePoint system against the National Sex Offenders Registry.
- Members are responsible for the behavior of their guests while they are in our facility. The Recreation Department reserves the right to ban future entry.
- All guests are required to complete the guest sign in sheet when entering the Community Center.
- Guests are required to leave the facility with the member once they have completed their activity.
- Discounted guest pass bundles can be purchased at the Community Center front desk only. Purchase 5 guest passes in advance for only \$20.00 and 10 in advance for only \$35.00.
